Good Neighbor Lawn Care & Pest Management Policy:

Children can be exposed to pesticides through food, water, home application, as well as treatment of child care facilities, schools, parks or lawns. Children's unique vulnerabilities and frequent hand-to-mouth behavior can expose them to significantly more pesticides compared to adults. The *American Academy of Pediatrics* advises "Children's exposure to pesticides should be limited as much as possible."¹

Caring for Our Children National Health and Safety Performance Standards includes the following standard *Integrated Pest Management* 5.2.8.1 which outlines policy guidelines regarding pest management.²

Pesticides are commonly used indoor and outdoor and often used when not needed. Iowa regulations for child care businesses do not require any use of these chemicals. Alternatives to pesticides and least toxic approaches (natural lawn care and Integrated Pest Management) do exist and have been proven to be effective and easy to administer.

The University of Northern Iowa's program initiative *Good Neighbor Iowa*³ is dedicated to reducing children's exposure to pesticides. Good Neighbor Iowa can assist your child care business in taking the necessary steps to protect child health from unnecessary pesticide exposure.
