


Iowa MIECHV Overview

The Health Resources Services Administration (HRSA) provides funding to lowa for the maternal, infant and early childhood home visitation (MIECHV) program. Contractors are required to use evidence-based home visiting models with fidelity and establish quantifiable, measurable benchmarks that demonstrate improvements in:

- Maternal and child health
- Childhood injury prevention
- · School readiness and achievement
- Crime or domestic violence prevention and intervention
- Family economic self-sufficiency, and coordination with community resources and support





Fiscal Year 2025 Snapshot

975 families served and 13,933 home visits provided

23% of primary caregivers did not have a high school diploma

52% of primary caregivers work full or part time

44% of families have a household income of 100% or less of federal poverty guidelines

98% of children are receiving their well-child exams by their medical provider

95% of eligible parents were screened for postpartum depression

88% of parents practice early literacy skills with their child daily

87% on track for communication

89% on track for fine motor

88% on track for gross motor

89% on track for personal/social development

90% on track for problem solving
