


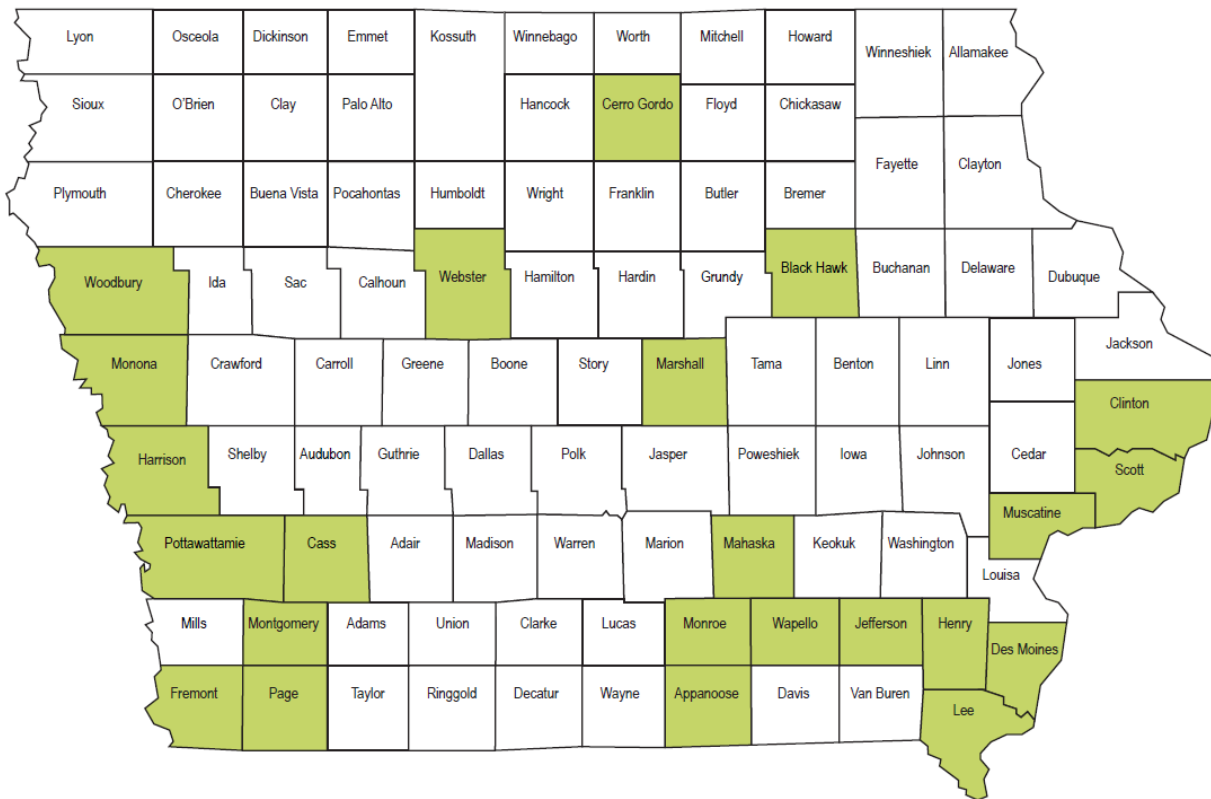
# Iowa MIECHV Overview

The Health Resources Services Administration (HRSA) provides funding to Iowa for the maternal, infant and early childhood home visitation (MIECHV) program. Contractors are required to use evidence-based home visiting models with fidelity and establish quantifiable, measurable benchmarks that demonstrate improvements in:

- Maternal and child health
- Childhood injury prevention
- School readiness and achievement
- Crime or domestic violence prevention and intervention
- Family economic self-sufficiency, and coordination with community resources and support

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## **Fiscal Year 2023 Snapshot**

**970** families served and 14,760 home visits provided

**22%** of primary caregivers did not have a high school diploma

**58%** of primary caregivers work full or part time

**58%** of families have a household income of 100% or less of federal poverty guidelines

**98%** of children are receiving their well child exams by their medical provider

**95%** of eligible parents were screened for postpartum depression

**87%** of parents practice early literacy skills with their child daily

### Developmental Screening Results for MIECHV children

**87%** on track for communication

**88%** on track for fine motor

**88%** on track for gross motor

**89%** on track for personal/social development

**89%** on track for problem solving

- DAISEY - Single Web-Based Data Collection and Reporting System
- Iowa Family Support Network (IFSN) - Statewide Coordinated Intake System for Family Support Services and Early Intervention
- Institute for the Advancement of Family Support Professionals – web-based professional development system and national credential for home visitors
- I2D2 - Integrated Data System to determine specific activities that produce better results for families
- Nine2Thrive Pilot – Coordinated intake co-located with prenatal health services
- PAEYS – Performance Incentive for Home Visitors and their Supervisors
- Phones4Families – Provides smart devices and data plans for enrolled families
- Workforce Evaluation – What keeps home visitors engaged in the field?
- Evaluation on Parent Engagement – What keeps families engaged in family support programming?
- T.E.A.C.H. provides comprehensive scholarships to family support professionals who wish to obtain college credits toward a degree relevant to their work in family support.

- Mental Health Consultation for MIECHV Supervisors and Family Support professionals that is designed to build their capacity to improve social, emotional and behavioral health and development of the young children and families they serve.
