	<ul> <li>Our federal report for BP4 of FR-CARP was completed and submitted in December. During BP4, 54 new EMS agencies were trained with our training module. 92% of participants reported that they felt they had learned new information and skills from the training. For data collection purposes, we utilize statewide EMS reports for naloxone administration and HHS vital statistics. Iowa has experienced an 18.5% increase in opioid-related deaths in 2021. However, this is a less significant rise compared to the 34% increase in death in 2020. During BP3, EMS reported 9.73% more patient encounters for suspected opioid overdose than the previous year. During BP4, patient encounters only increased by 3%.</li> <li>FR-CARP is currently in a No Cost Extension through September of this year. The Bureau does plan to apply for another four-year FR-CARP grant through SAMHSA, should another round of funding become available.</li> <li>Data Reports by Terry Smith:         <ul> <li>The quarterly Compass reports went out a couple of weeks ago to all services.</li> <li>Terry will be contacting a few services soon to see if they would be willing to help him test the transition to NEMSIS 3.5, the Elite Registry. A draft protocol has been created and a joint meeting with QASP has been scheduled. This will allow us additional stakeholder feedback and we look forward to garnering additional EMS support as we move through this process. The verification subcommittee of the TSAC is putting on hold the updates to the verification criteria due to the announcement from the ACS that level IV criteria are being worked on for release. Once released the system will move forward with updating the rules reference.</li> <li>The verification subcommittee is looking at the newly released gray book standards. Level 4 was left out of the verification criteria so it's on pause right now while that's being developed.</li> <li>The system development subcommittee has the state trauma plan out for stakeholder feedback.</li> <li>The Bureau will start distributing a newsletter as part of a new initiative.
