RELATIONAL AGGRESSION IN SCHOOL & BEYOND

2018 Iowa Youth Survey





- In 2018, name calling and teasing were at their highest in Iowa middle schools. 43% of 6th graders and 42% of 8th graders experienced being called names, made fun of, or teased in a hurtful way at school.
- For lowa 11th graders, 32% experienced the same.

SEXUAL COMMENTS

- Sexual jokes, comments and gestures also peaked in the middle school grades, especially for lowa female students. More than one in five 8th grade females experienced sexual jokes, comments or gestures at school in 2018.
- The problem persists into 11th grade with nearly the same number of female students experiencing the same. This compares to fewer than 1 in 10 11th grade males.



FALSE RUMORS

- Eighth grade females bore the brunt of lies and false rumors in 2018. While **35**% of 6th graders experienced having other students tell lies, spread false rumors, and do other things to make others dislike them, the number jumped to **43**% for 8th grade females.
- For 11th graders, **38**% of females reported the same compared to **24**% of males.



PHYSICAL FIGHTS

- 19% of 6th grade males were beaten up or fought with someone one or more times in the in 2019.
- The numbers decline for older students. 16% of 8th grade males and 10% of 11th grade males experienced the same.
- Roughly **10**% of females in any grade experienced physical fighting.

VIOLENCE AS PROBLEM SOLVING

- **Well over one-third** of 11th grade males held the belief that violence is an acceptable way to solve problems.
- Nearly 1 in 5 verbally threatened to physically harm someone.



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
