What is a Community Health Worker?

The American Public Health Association (2009):

A community Health Worker (CHW) is a frontline public health worker who is a trusted member of and/or has an unusually close understanding of the community served.

This trusting relationship enables the CHW to serve as liaison/link/intermediary between health/social services and the community to facilitate access to services and improve the quality and cultural competence of service delivery.

A CHW also builds individual and community capacity by increasing health knowledge and setfufficiency through a range of activities such as outreach, community education, informal counseling, social support and advocacy.



The U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics (2021):

"Community health workers promote health within a community by assisting individuals to adopt healthy behaviors.

They serve as an advocate for the health needs of individuals by assisting community residents in effectively communicating with healthcare providers or social service agencies.

They may act as liaison or advocate and implement programs that promote, maintain, and improve individual and overall community health and may deliver-inelated preventive services such as blood pressure, glaucoma, and hearing screenings.

CHWs may also collect data to help identify community health needs."

Statewide reach, targeting rural Iowa and individuals at/below 250% FPL





Skills Development Approach

Target Audience: CHWs, front line, patient/client facing roles

Five courses:

- Introduction to Community Health Work
- Core Competencies for Providing Direct Services
- Enhancing Client Interactions
- Enhancing Professional Skills
- Applying Core Competencies to Key Health Issues

Iowa CHW Registered Apprenticeship

- US Department of Labor-Approved
- Employer | CHW (apprentice) | ICCC partnership
- 75 people will be trained
- Tuition waived
- Stipends available (if eligible)



DOL Registered Apprenticeship

Five RA Components

- Employer involvement (Iowa has an intermediary program employer is a partner)
- Structured, paid on-the-job learning (1 year, grandfathering allowed)
- Job related educational instruction ("classroom" training, 147 hours, coursework, quizzes)
- Rewards for skill gains
- National occupational credential earned

Availability

- CHW Professional Skills Year 2, October 2023
- CHW Registered Apprenticeship Class to start November 2023 (tentative)
- Public Health Training for CHWs TBD



Eligibility

- Age 18 and older
- High school diploma/equivalency
- Must be a US Citizen or foreign national having possession of a visa permitting permanent residence in the United States
- Full time employment as CHW/similar role (Registered Apprenticeship only)
- Working in CHW role or other frontline role
 OR
- Desire to enter workforce/gain skills (CHW Professional Skills Only)
- Application process for each component
- Employer must allow receipt (stipend only)

Public Health AmeriCorps Grant
