Summary

- Legislation Overview (HF 708):
 - HF 708 requires HHS to establish a reimbursement add-on method by January 1, 2024.
 - The goal is to support Medicaid services for sex offenders in secure units within SNFs or NFs under Iowa Code, Chapter 692.

Intent of Legislation:

- Set a rate for proper care of sex offenders in SNFs and NFs.
- Ensure the health, safety, and wellbeing of staff and residents in Iowa SNFs and NFs.

Ground Emergency Medical Transportation (GEMT) has moved from 68 enrolled EMS providers two years ago to over 90 enrolled for FY24.



The dental enhanced fee schedule will bring dental payments up to the average commercial rate for University of Iowa and Broadlawns dental services.



Trialing the use of Transportation Network Companies, like Lyft, in the NEMT space to improve medical transportation.



A directed payment recently approved by CMS will increase revenue for 121 privately operated hospitals across Iowa.

Adjustments to Dental Rates

Based on last year's Medicaid provider rate review, rates are being adjusted to be more equitable compared to the benchmark.

2024 Rate Review

- First few years focused on raising all rates to 85% of benchmark
- Proposed increases this year to:
 - Medical supplies
 - Physician assistants
 - Physical and occupational therapy
 - Certified nurse midwife
 - Community mental health center
- Targeted increases to address access needs
 - Home and community-based services
 - Home health

- In fall 2022, Iowa Medicaid formed a team to turn quarterly and yearly MCO reports into an interactive digital dashboard.

- The dashboard not only includes existing "Medical" reports but also now features "Dental" and Fee-For-Service (FFS) data that wasn't previously shown.

SFY2024 MCO Contracts and Rates

Iowa HHS recently executed two contracts with Wellpoint (formerly Amerigroup) and Molina (MOL) to administer the Iowa Health Link Program.

- The Iowa Total Care (ITC) contract was amended to align all three contracts.
- In addition to the contracts, there have been three amendments executed to include changes to rates and update contract language based on Iowa Legislation.

These contract and amendments are still pending approval by CMS and may be subject to change.

Continuous Coverage Unwind



Continuous Coverage Unwind Update

On December 29, 2022, the Consolidated Appropriations Act was signed into law.

This law included updated language within the Families First Coronavirus Response Act that 'de-linked' the Medicaid continuous coverage requirement from the federal PHE.

This set a final date of the continuous coverage requirement of March 31, 2023.

2 Prior to the continuous coverage requirement ending, CMS issued guidance that outlined Medicaid eligibility processing requirements for states during an unwinding period after the continuous coverage requirement ended.

All states are required by CMS to conduct a full review of eligibility for all individuals on Medicaid consistent with federal requirements prior to discontinuing their coverage.

MCO Engagement

lowa Medicaid is working closely with MCOs and dental care plans to ensure all members are given additional communications about the unwinding and their renewal period.

CMS approved waivers for lowa to increase our ability to get updated contact information from members. Each month after renewal packets are sent to households, the MCOs and HHS Contact Center are conducting outreach to remind members to return their renewal forms.

NCOA database address update to ensure reaching members and up to date contact information.

Address changes reported to HHS by MCOs.
