Where it Began - The Why



POPULATION ESTIMATES (18 AND OLDER)

Gambling

- 46% of adults gamble regularly (past 30 days)
- 14% at risk (315,000)
- 1% problem

Alcohol Use

- 63.2% use in past month
- Alcohol Use Disorder 7.2%
- Binge use in past month 30.8%
- 7% needed treatment but did not receive

Other Substance Use


- 7.2% used Marijuana in the past month
- 9.1% Substance Use Disorder
- 8.3% needed treatment but did not receive

Mental Health

- 19% (18 and older) Any mental illness in the past vear
- 8.7% experience a major depressive episode in the past year
- · 5.4% had serious thoughts of suicide
- 53.6% with any mental illness that received care
- Suicide Rate (2020) approximately 18 per 100K lowans
- Death by Suicide (CY 2020) - provisional: 592

Overlap in substance abuse + mental health


• 50% who experience mental illness also experience problems with substance use.









Miquel's Story

YOU ARE NEVER ALONE

Miquel* called the Your Life Iowa crisis line one evening and reported having thoughts of suicide. The caller had been consuming alcohol as well which had not helped him to feel better. During the suicide screening, the man endorsed two specific plans but indicated he did not truly want to die and wanted help. He was tearful throughout the call, and the YLI counselor provided support and compassion while assessing for the caller's immediate risk of harm to himself. Our counselor explained and offered to have Mobile Crisis Outreach (MCO) respond to better provide some in-person support to the caller (and also to help mitigate the risk of suicide that was evident). The caller accepted this offer and indicated he could keep himself safe until MCO arrived, and additional safety plan components were put into place.





Suicide Data

UNITED STATES

44,834 people died by suicide in the United States in 2020

Results from SAMSHA's 2020 National Survey on Drug Use and Health estimate that within the last year:

- 12.2 million adults (age 18+) had serious thoughts of suicide
- 3.4 million adults made a suicide plan
- 1.2 million adults attempted suicide
- 3.0 million youth (ages 12 17) had serious thoughts of suicide
- 1.3 million youth made a suicide plan
- 629,000 youth attempted suicide



Suicide Data

IOWA

- Suicide is the 2nd leading cause of death for ages 14-44 in Iowa
- 550 Iowans died by suicide in 2020
- Between 27% to 36% of students (depending on grade level) surveyed in Iowa reported feeling so sad or hopeless almost every day for 2 weeks or more in a row that they stopped doing some usual activities - Iowa Youth Survey 2021









Suicide Deaths by Life Stage, 2020

Use of Real Time Data

January 2021 - Dr. Bottei alerted IDPH to a concerning increase in calls to Iowa Poison Control regarding intentional overdoses of young females between the ages of 10-14

January 2022 - County Medical Examiner reported a sharp uptick in suicides in their county

March 2022 - Dr. Bottei alerted IDPH to another increase in calls, this time regarding intentional overdoses of 10-19 year old females



Say Something About Suicide There Are People Who Care

CAMPAIGN OBJECTIVES

- Let the audience know help is available
- Connect people with thought of suicide and their loved ones to Your Life Iowa's 24/7 resources.
- Education the community of suicidal ideation and self-harm behaviors.
- Increase website traffic, calls/texts/chats and the number of people accessing resources AND reduce suicide attempts and deaths.



Say Something About Suicide There Are People Who Care

MEDIA STRATEGIES


- Place emphasis on video executions to raise awareness of the help that is available.
- Use social media and digital display to engage with the target audiences on their preferred platforms.
- Flight media around existing YLI campaigns to maximize the campaign presence.
- Negotiate "added value" to extend the campaign and no additional cost.




