<u>Purpose:</u> Identifying a participant with a first episode of psychosis minimizes the potential for long term disability.

All FEP contractors utilize Navigate, an evidence-based program. Fidelity to the model is critical. It is team based with a Prescriber for medication, Individualize Resiliency Training (therapist), a Family Educational Provider (FEP), a Community Support Specialist/Case Manager and an Employment and Education Specialist.

Deliverables: Trainings and attendance at meetings for team members monitored closely

Fidelity to the model by each team member is assessed every 6 months

Any deviation from model must be approved by DHS

Each program serves 35-45 unduplicated individuals per year

Data collection to include: Admissions, employment status, education status, days

of inpatient care, number enrolled, age of individuals in program.

All FEP participants must be diagnosed with one of the following: non-affective psychosis, schizophrenia, schizoaffective, schizophreniform, brief psychotic disorder and psychotic disorder NOS
