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Pursuant to the provisions of Iowa Code Sections 17A.18, 147A.7, and Iowa Administrative Code (I.A.C.) 641—131.7, the Iowa Department of Public Health is proposing to **REVOKE** your EMS certification identified above.

The department may revoke an EMS certification when it finds that the certificate holder has committed any of the following acts or offenses:

Fraud in procuring certification or renewal including, but not limited to:
(2) False representation of a material fact, whether by word or by conduct, by false or misleading allegations, or by concealment of that which should have been disclosed when making application for a certification in this state.
Iowa Code Section 147A(1)d and IAC 641-131.7(2)d

Knowingly making misleading, deceptive, untrue or fraudulent representation in the practice of the profession or engaging in unethical conduct or practice harmful or detrimental to the public. Proof of actual injury need not be established.
Iowa Code Section 147A.7(1)f and IAC 641-131.7(2)f

Violating a statute of this state, or the United States, without regard to its designation as either a felony or misdemeanor, which relates to the provision of emergency medical care, including but not limited to a crime involving dishonesty, fraud, theft, embezzlement, controlled substances, substance abuse, assault, sexual misconduct, or homicide. A copy of the record of conviction or plea of guilty is conclusive evidence of the violation.
Iowa Code Section 147A.7(1)j and IAC 641—131.7(2)t

The following incidents resulted in issuance of this proposed action:

You were convicted of the following crime:

- Possession of Alcohol by a Person Under Age on October 8, 1995

You answered the question, “have you ever been convicted of, found guilty of, or entered a plea of no contest to a felony or misdemeanor crime,” in the negative when completing the EMS Certification Application for the First Responder or EMT-Basic on March 23, 2006 and on the retest application and when completing the EMS Certification Written Examination Retest Application on June 21, 2006 and September 8, 2006.


You received a deferred conviction for the following crime:

- Second Degree Theft on November 20, 2007


According to the trail information submitted by you, this conviction resulted from your theft of \$9,119.22 from a youth sports organization. At the time of the crime, you served as President of the organization.

You have the right to request a hearing concerning this notice of disciplinary action. A request for a hearing must be submitted in writing to the Department by certified mail, return receipt requested, within twenty (20) days of receipt of this Notice of Proposed Action. The written request must be submitted to the Iowa Department of Public Health, Bureau of Emergency Medical Services, Lucas State Office Building, 321 E 12th St, Des Moines, Iowa 50319. If the request is made within the twenty (20) day time limit, the proposed action is suspended pending the outcome of the hearing. Prior to or at the hearing, the Department may rescind the notice upon satisfaction that the reason for the action has been or will be removed.

If no request for a hearing is received within the twenty (20) day time period, the disciplinary action proposed herein shall become effective and shall be final agency action.
