

Update on Environmental Scan March 15, 2023

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Provide training, technical assistance, and fidelity monitoring for entities responsible for developing and implementing evidencebased practices for individuals with serious mental illness, serious emotional disturbance, and co-occurring conditions in lowa.



Environmental Scan – Preliminary Results

Between June 2022 and August 2022, the Center of Excellence for Behavioral Health met with 13 MHDS Regional CEOs, 13 ACT providers, 5 IPS providers, and 10 housing program service providers to gather information about their respective work on EBPs.

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Environmental Scan – Key Takeaways

• Training:

- Varying levels of training being provided, requested; all entities are completing staff training/onboarding
- Barriers include staff time, turnover, and financing, awareness of trainings
- Fidelity Monitoring:
 - -Varying levels of engagement with and completion of reviews
 - Barriers include time to complete reviews lack of understanding the fidelity review process

Environmental Scan – Fidelity Reviews

- What has worked well?
 - Immediate feedback, report review optional
 - Clear, positive approach
 - Prior familiarity with the review measure
 - Having well established provider operations
- Barriers Identified
 - Data difficulty identifying, pulling, streamlining
 - Time-consuming for staff to prepare
 - Standardization lack of standard forms and format
 - Staffing challenges create hesitancy to complete review

Environmental Scan – Trainings

- What has worked well?
 - Regions, providers, stakeholders are providing and participating in several in-person, hybrid, and virtual trainings paid for by agency funding, MHDS Regions, Medicaid, MHBG, CCBHC, and Zero Suicide Prevention.
- Barriers Identified
 - Limited staff time, causing time away from clients
 - -Lack of funding (for training & travel)
 - Lack of knowledge of available trainings
 - -Lack of focus on rural areas

Environmental Scan – Addt. EBPs cont.

- Barriers to selecting/implementing/documenting
 - Not clear what treatments are considered EBPs
 - Training for new employees
 - Trainings are costly and/or difficult to obtain
 - Staff turnover creates ongoing need for training
 - EBPs not funded by Medicaid
 - Cost of EBP implementation
 - Time needed to implement/maintain EBPs
 - Not enough guidance on documenting EBPs
 - Documenting EBPs is excessively burdensome

- Currently providing technical assistance to Kansas for the development of their ACT Teams

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Supporting Iowa's Behavioral Health Workforce:

Staff Resiliency & Wellness and Trauma-Informed Leadership

In this two-day workshop, attendees will explore two foundational concepts for supporting behavioral health service professionals: **Staff Resiliency & Wellness**, healing and helping professionals are at risk of experiencing issues that mirror those of the people they serve. Research demonstrates the dangerous impact on physical and emotional health when exposed to trauma combined with a stressful work environment. Knowledge is the best defense against burnout, vicarious trauma, and compassion fatigue. This training goes further than other self-care trainings by addressing the critical elements of health to enhance productivity and quality of work on both an individual and organizational level; and **Trauma-Informed Leadership**, the stress of working with people struggling with trauma has put those in the helping and healing professions at significant risk for burnout and other dangers. Trauma-Informed Leadership gives leaders the skills and knowledge necessary to propel their programs and organizations towards excellence. This training provides a practical model to enhance staff health while maximizing system and organizational outcomes. Learners will leave this training with a new paradigm of Leadership and trauma-informed approaches for the supervision of staff and management of programs.



Matt Bennett, MBA, MA, is a relentless advocate for trauma-informed care and other interventions that help people and communities heal. His passion manifests in his books Connecting Paradigms, Talking about Trauma & Change, Heart Variability, and Trauma-Sensitive Early Education as well as his Trauma-Informed Lens and Heart Rate Variability Podcasts. Mr. Bennett combines his masters' degrees in community psychology and business administration with his practical experience as a therapist and leader to develop research-based solutions to improve the health of individuals, staff, organizations, and systems. Connecting Paradigms:

Trauma-Informed Motivational Interviewing for Behavioral Health Service Providers

In a quick-paced and dynamic training, participants learn Motivational Interviewing (MI) skills in the context of trauma-informed care, Harm Reduction, and the Stages of Change. Many of those who engage in services face critical changes if they are to reach the employment and social outcomes, we hope for them. Recent research on the brain and trauma gives those working with clients a new paradigm to improve outcomes for clients experiencing issues such as homelessness, substance abuse, mental health issues, post-traumatic stress disorder, and poverty. This training presents the trauma-informed paradigm in a practical context, giving participants both a theoretical basis and tools to apply immediately to their work with patients.
