IV. Legislative Report/Update

Legislators Iowa Tobacco Prevention Alliance

Sen. Quirmbach:

Senator Quirmbach stated he scanned the Senate Study Bill 3158, the Health and Human Services appropriations bill. Quirmbach stated that the only mention of the word tobacco is in Division III and it is regarding the funding, which is \$4,020,894. Quirmbach stated there is a section in Division XI, which basically states that until the transition is complete that everything will remain the same. Quirmbach stated it seems that the commission's legal status is not affected until the Legislature takes specific action. Quirmbach stated that he did not see anything that undermines the commission role or authority.

Quirmbach called attention to Senate File 2263. Quirmbach stated that if this bill moves forward it will abolish senate confirmation for almost 30 boards and commissions.

A. Discussion on CDC funding recommendations calculations Dr. Robert Nichols Jerilyn Oshel stated that a document was sent out to show these calculations. It can be found here <u>CDC Recommended Funding Levels</u>. Belitsos stated it is dated 2014 and asked why it hasn't been updated. Oshel stated that this was the last time the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) updated it.

B. HF 2523 bill to define e-cigarettes as tobacco products and have them taxed as such

A lot of discussion was had from commission members about the content of the bill. Belitsos made a motion to draft a letter that states the commissions support for redefining vapor and alternative nicotine products as tobacco products and communicate that to appropriate members of the Legislature. Dr. Aoki second. Unanimous approval.

VI. Division Director's Report/Update

Jerilyn Oshel

A. Budget:

Oshel reported that as of March 1, the Division has spent 66% of the budget. Oshel reported that the Division continues to work with contractors to get the funds spent according to Best Practices. Oshel reported that the Quitline Request for Proposal (RFP) closed on March 3 and the Community Partnership Request for Application (RFA) closed on March 23. Beltisos asked how many applications were submitted for the Quitline RFP. Oshel stated there was one applicant.

B. Alignment update:

Oshel discussed the functional org chart that was emailed out and stated the Tobacco Division will be housed under Public Health, under the Community and Public Health function. Oshel addressed concerns in the conversation about this merger trying to shrink the Department. Oshel stated that the goal of the merger is not to shrink state government in general, but it is truly to strengthen our coordination among the existing services and to provide a more comprehensive service to lowans

VII. TUPC Program Update:

A. **Iowa Students for Tobacco Education Prevention (ISTEP)** ISTEP Youth Courtney Sweet reported that there are 72 chapters across 45 counties in Iowa and 13 are newly established. Sweet reported that ISTEP and My Life My Quit (MLMQ) are partnering together on April 1 to do some street marketing events in the schools. Sweet stated that the ISTEP Summit is being held April 19 at the Iowa State Fairgrounds in the Varied Industries Building.
