
## 1. Functioning, Key Features, UX

How it Works, What it Looks Like

### Summary of What People Want (So far)

- Easy to access and use web-based interface
- Responsive/fast user experience
- Ability to filter along desired characteristics (e.g., quarter, gender, county, diagnosis)
- Start with a few key metrics
- Up-to-date data is essential
- Determine how the dashboard will be used
- Unique cases in aggregate
- Visual trend data, map data

Outcome 1: All children receive a behavioral health screening.


Outcome 2: All children are free of impairment from un-addressed behavioral health concerns or issues.

Outcome 3: All children have access to a gold standard of care.


Outcome 4: All children have a support system.

### Outcome

Outcome 2. All children are free of impairment from un-addressed behavioral health concerns or issues.

### Metrics

2.1. Decrease in youth suicide ideation, attempts, and completions.

2.2 (New). Hospitalization decreases (due to mental health), outpatient/in between/ and inpatient services

2.3 (New). Decrease in the number of children needing behavioral health services.

2.1.1. % of students reporting suicidal ideation (full sample) within the last 12 months for 6th, 8th, and 11<sup>th</sup> grade (IYS)

2.1.2. % of students reporting attempting suicide (full sample) within the last 12 months for 6th, 8th, and 11<sup>th</sup> grade (IYS)

2.3.1. Iowa Medicaid and Children with Serious Emotional Disturbance (SED), Iowa Medicaid Dashboard, Serious Emotional Disturbance – Managed Care Organization (SED – MCO) & Fee For Service (FFS)

# 3. Development/Procurement

Internal Development or Contract to External Vendor(s)

### Next Key Proposed Actions

- 1. Continue developing mock-ups, user experience goals.
- Gather data from internal and external stakeholders to establish technological needs.
- 3. Gather data to establish estimated costs and budgets.
- 4. Determine if development will be accomplished in-house or via procurement.
- 5. Secure and analyze publicly-available data to help with
  - 1. Initial development,
  - 2. Establishing data-sharing agreements for data not currently available, while also
  - 3. Working on legislative report for December 2024.

### Proposed Timeline: Key Benchmarks

- April 2024: Finalize data dashboard development plan.
- June 2024: Finalize data sources for legislative report for all 5 Outcomes.
- July 2024: Begin procurement OR internal staffing for development.
- August 2024: Finish data display for all 5 Outcomes for legislative report.
- November 2024: Begin data dashboard development.
- March 2024: Begin data dashboard user testing.
- July 2025: Launch Phase 1 of Data Dashboard.
