





Objectives:


Understand existing initiatives that could complement and support the MPA.

- Connecting and convening multiple sectors and professions that provide the supports, services, and infrastructure to promote healthy aging.
- Better inclusion of disability throughout.
- Feasibility of implementing solutions by garnering leadership support.
