# Multisector Plan for Aging, including Aging with Disabilities (MPA) Steering Committee Charter

#### **Purpose**

The MPA is a long-term plan for Iowa to help people age well in their communities. The Steering Committee wants input from community partners, professionals, and the public to create a more organized system. This system aims to support healthy aging, independent living, and social engagement, while also dealing with issues like healthcare, housing, transportation, and other factors affecting health.

### **Objectives**

The objectives of the Steering Committee are:

- 1. Understand existing initiatives that could complement and support the MPA.
- 2. Advise and provide recommendations to HHS in the development of the MPA.

#### Membership

Iowa HHS selects Steering Committee members, including diverse individuals from Iowa, community partners and professionals interested in building a coordinated and high-quality care system in Iowa. The Committee size is limited for effective discussions.

The Steering Committee is supported by Iowa's HHS – Division of Aging and Disability Services (ADS).

# **Guiding Principles**

- Steering Committee meetings will provide a transparent, collaborative, and respectful environment to allow for open and productive discussions for all members' points of view.
- 2. A person-centered, data-driven approach will guide Steering Committee efforts and align with the values of HHS and priorities identified by the community.



# **Operating Principles**

- 1. The Steering Committee is a short-term, focused effort lasting several months starting in February 2024. Meetings will be held regularly.
- 2. The Steering Committee will be led by a representative from HHS and facilitated by an outside consultant.
- 3. Subcommittee topical areas and meetings will be identified and established by the Steering Committee as needed and will meet and complete work during the same period as the Steering Committee.
- 4. Participation in the Steering Committee is voluntary; compensation will not be provided including for travel costs or other meeting expenses.
- 5. Meeting agendas and materials will be posted to the HHS web page dedicated to the development of the MPA.

# Member Responsibilities

Members of the Steering Committee will be responsible for:

- 1. Bringing personal and professional expertise on issues for inclusion in the MPA.
- 2. Provide oversight and guidance on MPA Subcommittee structure, membership, timeline, and process, including determining topical areas for which subcommittees need to be formed.
- 3. Attend and contribute to subcommittee activities.
- 4. Gather input from subcommittees on priority issues, needs, and gaps related to identified topic areas and related recommendations.
- 5. Finalize recommendations on priority issues to address within the MPA and potential strategies and initiatives to address them.
- 6. Prioritize meeting attendance, review meeting materials, and actively engage in meetings and related activities. Regular, consistent attendance at meetings is essential to achieving the Steering Committee's goals.

## **Public Input**

While the Steering Committee is limited to appointed members, members of the public will have opportunities to provide public comment and submit feedback to the Steering Committee.
