Program Description:

- lowa Family Support Network (formerly known as Early ACCESS Iowa)
 - Provides a coordinated intake and referral system.
 - Assist families, child healthcare providers, and other professionals with:
 - Information and support
 - Linkages to resources for young children ages zero to five.

Early Access and EHDI Referrals



Children at Home

The Children at Home program is designed to assist you and your family in securing the services and supports that you identify as necessary in helping your child remain at home. An underlying principle of the Children at Home program is that you and your family retain control of decisions which affect your child and family. Financial assistance is intended to enable you to obtain those services and supports which are not met by other programs.



What is Children at Home

Purpose of Children at Home

- Enables a family member of an individual with a disability to:
 - identify the services and support needed to enable the individual to reside with the individual's family,
 - function more independently, and
 - increase the individual's integration into the community.





Background of Children at Home

 lowa Department of Health and Human oversees the Iowa Family Support Network.

The Children at Home Program is integrated into this existing coordinated intake and referral system.



Program History

- Previously the Children at Home Program had been operating in 23 counties in Iowa.
 - Blackhawk, Boone, Cass, Cerro Gordo, Chickasaw, Clinton, Crawford, Dubuque, Floyd, Grundy, Harrison, Jackson, Johnston, Keokuk, Mahaska, Mills, Mitchell, Monroe, Montgomery, Story, Wapello, Washington, Woodbury.
- There were 8 contractors that each served 1-4 counties.
 - Operation and delivery of the program varied among contractors.
- In 2016, the program was rolled out to all 99 lowa counties within the first year under EveryStep
 - Focus on bringing continuity to program

Eligibility for Children at Home

- The family resides in the state of lowa.
- The family includes an individual with a disability under
 22 years of age.
- The family expresses an intent for the family member who is an individual with a disability to remain living in the family's home.
- The family's taxable net income is less than \$60,000 in the most recently completed tax year.

The application has 4 parts

- 1. Family demographics (child name, family info, address, etc.)
- 2. **Income info** (additional documentation to be submitted to verify)
- 3. **Certification of Disability Info** (if child is on Waiver or SSI additional info is not needed, if not on Waiver or SSI then a professional needs to sign off to certify disability)
- 4. Application for funds (the item/service the family is requesting, details on payment, justification of how expense ties to disability and assists in the ability for child to remain in the home and provider sign off)

Focus of Funding



- The intent of the project is to direct funds towards services and supports for a child as it relates to their disability.
- These services and supports should enable the child to remain living in the family home.

- As EveryStep staff review applications, they are tasked with ensuring the request for the item/service is related to the child's disability.
- EveryStep Staff will be looking for the connection of the request to the child's disability and how it assists in the ability of the child to remain living in the family home.

Available Funding

- Goal is to approve a minimum of \$700 per eligible child within the Fiscal Year (July 1st through June 30th)
- Funds are not guaranteed and are monitored monthly
- Requests for large amounts are presented to program manager/director for approval
- Families may apply every Fiscal Year with a new application.

Funding of the item or service

- CaH is a payer of last resort (work together with other programs, such as waiver, to both cover a portion of item/service)
- Items and services must occur and be purchased within the current Fiscal Year.
- Three options for payment:
 - CaH may purchase the item online and have it directly shipped to the family.
 - □ Family may purchase the item and we may reimburse them.
 - CaH may pay the agency directly

Personal Care and Nutrition

- Milk/Vitamin supplements
- High protein supplements
- Diapers (over age 5)

Allowable Funding Request Categories (cont)

Respite/Adaptive Childcare

- Respite care
- Adaptive childcare (over the age of 12)



Transportation/Travel

- Hotel
- Mileage reimbursement
- Travel Stipend- air fare, car rental, meals for out of state travel



Allowable Funding Request Categories (cont)

Safety

- Fence
- Door alarms
- Locks
- Rider safe harness
- Service Dog

Vehicle/Home modification

- Wheelchair lift
- Ramp
- Accessible



Categories that will **NOT** be considered for funding

- Basic child items (non-adaptive) clothes, shoes, school supplies, food, toys.
- Basic living expenses (rent, water, utilities, heat/LP, etc.)
- Childcare for a child age 12 or younger unless there are extenuating circumstances specifically pertaining to a child's disability that is above and beyond everyday child care costs.

Categories that will **NOT** be considered for funding (cont.)

- Adoption fees or guardianship costs
- Costs incurred from illegal activities such as court costs and fines.
- □ Firearms/weapons, of any kind
- Insurance deductibles and co-pays for services,
 deductibles and copays may be considered for equipment
- □ Phone, Phone minutes
- Purchase of or repair of vehicles
 (Modification/adaptation of vehicles is an allowable request)

Iowa Family Support Network & Children at Home

While Children at Home funds can not be directed to basic living and child expenses, as a part of the lowa Family Support Network's broader function, they will be able to help direct families to a wide range of resources to assist with basic living and child expenses.
