### **Objectives:**

- Understand existing initiatives that could complement and support the MPA.
- Advise and provide recommendations to HHS in the development of the MPA.

## Steering Committee Charter – Member Responsibilities

• Bring personal and professional expertise on issues for inclusion in the MPA.

- Provide oversight and guidance on subcommittee structure, timeline, and process, including determining topical areas for which subcommittees need to be formed.
- Attend and contribute to subcommittee activities.

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- Gather input on priorities, needs, and gaps related for developing recommendations.
- Finalize recommendations on priority issues to address within the MPA and potential strategies and initiatives to address them.
- Prioritize meeting attendance, review meeting materials, and actively engage in meetings and related activities.
