<u>Iowa LIHEAP FY24 Policy and Procedures Manual</u>

Listed below are notable changes to the *Iowa LIHEAP Policy and Procedures Manual* for the FY24 program year.

15.60 Service Continuity – Energy

- This notice sets an effective date of March 20th, 2024 for the start of ECIP Service Continuity to allow for a proactive approach to the end of Iowa's winter moratorium.
- This notice also requires that an imminent threat of disconnection be present when approving Service Continuity assistance. Disconnection can be considered "imminent" when:
 - 1) A disconnect notice has been issued and/or a date of disconnection is specified by the vendor
 - 2) A customer is on a payment arrangement with the vendor and cannot meet the minimum requirement of that arrangement, thus resulting in disconnection
 - 3) The vendor has public-facing materials that plainly state the amount of time allowed between when a payment is due and when disconnection will occur if payment is not made, and the customer is within that window of time

Note - Being past-due on a bill, but not meeting any of the 3 criteria described above, should not be considered an imminent threat of disconnection.

Agencies that are unsure if a particular customer qualifies for Service Continuity under the 3 criteria above should contact the state LIHEAP office for further guidance.
