HHS and Division Updates for Aging & Disability Services and Behavioral Health Services

2024 Iowa Legislative Session Ends

The 2024 legislative session ended in the early morning hours on April 20. Some of the notable legislative actions relating to health and human services include:

- Modernizing the Health and Human Services Budget
- Expanding adult services to establishing the first children's mental health system and increasing funding
- Combining lowa's 32 mental health and substance use regions into seven unified behavioral health districts to better provide consistent services, coordinate care system wide, and improve outcomes for lowans
- Passing of a new HHS appropriations bill with significant investments in Medicaid, including community-based services and behavioral health rates, child welfare and agency infrastructure
- Supporting of the Governor's THRIVE initiative (THRIVE lowa is a new resource through HHS that will create a network of navigators to help at-risk individuals find immediate support from community organizations, then follow them over time helping them develop an individualized plan for self-sufficiency and long-term independence.)
- Funding the childcare market rate survey increase and extending the childcare assistance pilot
- Fully funding a building expansion at the Office of the State Medical Examiner
- Increasing foster care rates for families by 5%
- Increasing adoption subsidy rates for families by 5%
- Fully funding State Operated Specialty Care at the State Training School, Cherokee and Independence Mental Health Institutes, Woodward Resource Center, and CCUSO (Civil Commitment Unit for Sexual Offenders)

Here is a list of HHS and related bills passed this session with links to the full bill text:

HF 2673 – Behavioral Health System Alignment Bill, which will re-configure Iowa's mental health, addiction, and disability services system. A second phase is expected to follow that will provide for Public Health System Alignment - <u>Iowa Legislature - BillBook HF2673</u>

SF 2251 – 12 Months of Postpartum Medicaid Coverage – this extends postpartum Medicaid coverage from 60 days to 12 months - <u>lowa Legislature - BillBook SF2251</u>

HF 2402 – PMIC Bill - provides for funding to bring in a new PMIC (psychiatric medical institution for children) to the state to address children with complex and aggressive behaviors, including sexualized behaviors - <u>lowa Legislature - BillBook HF2402</u>

SF 2385 – Boards and Commissions - reviews, creates, reconfigures, and eliminates many of Iowa's Governor-appointed boards and commissions (this is a long (235 pages) and detailed bill) - <u>Iowa Legislature - BillBook SF2385</u>

- Eliminates the Autism Council and creates and Iowa Special Education Council
- Eliminates the Hawki Board
- Eliminates the Advisory Committee for Children with Special Health Care Needs
- Eliminate the Childrens' Behavioral Health System State Board
- Amends the duties of the Council on Human Services
- Establishes community action agencies
- Establishes a Deaf Services Commission

- SF 2285 Streamline Legislative Reports Iowa Legislature BillBook SF2285

Infusing Health Equity into Our Work

Health Equity is the attainment of the highest possible level of health for all people, meaning achieving the environmental, social, economic, and other conditions in which all people have the opportunity to attain their highest possible level of health

- Health equity requires valuing everyone equally with focused and ongoing societal efforts to address avoidable inequities, historical and contemporary injustices, and the elimination of health and healthcare disparities
- The lowa Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) has developed initial policies and plans for embedding health equity across internal and external work through accreditation, workforce development, data management, and planning efforts

- A primary objective over the next few years is to ensure that Iowa HHS has thoroughly examined and addressed opportunities to significantly shift efforts and resources towards eliminating institutional and structural inequities that lead to disproportionately negative outcomes for some populations
- Foundational work includes adoption of this health equity framework and focus areas, and a health equity implementation plan:
 - Organizational Culture
 - Internal Policies and Procedures
 - Data Equity Framework
 - Planning and Performance Improvement
 - o Partnerships and Community Engagement

HOME - Hope and Opportunity in Many Environments

The HOME project aims to improve and ensure that everyone in Iowa has access to high-quality behavioral health, disability, and aging services in their communities by:

- Streamlining screening and enrollment
 - Screening everyone on the HCBS Waiver wait list
 - Improving the screening and enrollment experience
 - Developing improved underlying data and IT architecture to support the experience
- Aligning program design to meet lowan's needs
 - Integrating lowan's insights into the new waiver program design
 - Developing uniform services assessment tools
 - Analyzing options for funding waiver redesign
 - Improve access to services and support for lowans
 - Enhancing how people navigate the system
 - Improving case management

Progress Update:

- The current waitlist journey of waiver applicants has been mapped out
- The NOW (Needs on Waitlist) Survey has been launched and is underway
- Future waitlist management priorities have been identified
- Iowans have been engaged to provide input to improve waiver design through HOMEtown Conversations
- Proposed changes to the waiver structure, eligibility, and service definitions have been developed based on the input received
- A survey of lowan's experiences in accessing waivers and waiver services has been completed

Statewide LTSS Learning Management System

lowa Medicaid continues to work with a contractor, Trualta, LLC, to develop a Statewide Learning Management System (LMS) for Long Term Services and Supports (LTSS) providers and case managers.

- Providers include home-based programs, rehabilitation services, habilitation services, home health, hospice, Money Follows the Person program, nursing/personal care, care for aging lowans, and case management.
- The goal of which is to support activities that lead to better health and performance outcomes for providers, direct support professionals and family caregivers and improve the delivery of long-term services and supports.

Service System Alignment

As discussed in previous updates, HHS has contracted with Health Management Associates (HMA) to study the delivery of health and human service programs in our state. We now have new legislation that will impact how the alignment moves forward.
