She worked as a social worker in New York, NY, for more than a decade before transplanting to Des Moines, IA, in 2015 with her wife and two kids. She is a graduate of Hunter College with a Master of Social Work (MSW) and is credentialed as a Licensed Clinical Social Worker (LCSW) and Licensed Independent Social Worker (LISW).

She has worked with runaway and homeless teens, LGBTQ youth, and families, children and youth involved with the child welfare system for the past 20 years. Most recently, she served for four (4) years as the Child Welfare and Community Services Bureau Chief for DHS and as the Division Administrator over Adult, Children and Family Services (ACFS) beginning in 2020, until her transition to Division Director of Family Well-Being and Protection for HHS in 2022. In addition to her professional roles within Child Welfare, she was a foster parent for seven (7) years and is an adoptive parent.
