

## Introduction

Southern Hills Regional Mental Health was formed under Iowa Code Chapter 28E to create a Mental Health and Disability Service Region in compliance with Iowa Code 331.390. The annual report is a component of the Management Plan which includes three parts: Annual Service and Budget Plan, Annual Report and Policies and Procedures Manual in compliance with Iowa Administrative Code 441.25.

Southern Hills is committed to providing the most appropriate/least restrictive services for eligible persons in our region, If a specific service is not available in our regional geographic area we work with other regions to ensure that access to needed services are available. .

The FY2022 Annual Report covers the period of July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2022. The annual report includes documentation of the status of service development, services actually provided, individuals served, designated intensive mental health services, a financial statement including revenues, expenditures and levies and specific regional outcomes for the year.

The region has designated the following **Intensive Residential Service** providers which meet the following requirements:

- Enrolled as an HCBS 1915(i) habilitation or an HCBS 1915(c) intellectual disability waiver supported community living provider.
- Provide staffing 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year.
- Maintain staffing ratio of one staff to every two and on-half residents.
- Ensure that all staff have the minimum qualifications required.
- Provider coordination with the individual’s clinical mental health and physical health treatment, and other services and support.
- Provide clinical oversight by a mental health professional
- Have a written cooperative agreement with an outpatient provider.
- Be licensed as a substance abuse treatment program or have a written cooperative agreement.
- Accept and service eligible individuals who are court-ordered.
- Provide services to eligible individuals on a no reject, no eject basis.
- Serve no more than five individuals at a site.
- Be located in a neighborhood setting to maximize community integration and natural supports.

- Demonstrate specialization in serving individuals with an SPMI or multi-occurring conditions and serve individuals with similar conditions in the same site.

**D. Status of Service Development in FY2022**

Southern Hills Regional Mental Health has been working to develop a complete array of children’s and adult behavioral services. We have successfully added a jail diversion program. Our children’s service coordination is in place. We are working with adjoining regions to implement our Mobile Crisis and ACT programs. We are ready to designate an access center and its components. Work continues within the region and with adjoining regions to provide a complete array.

**E. Outcomes/Regional Accomplishments in FY2022**

Southern Hills Regional Mental Health was consistent in meeting Core Services Access Standards that were mandated to be in place. The region is working to provide all core services that are mandated. We continue to meet with providers/public to examine the needs for and availability of services.

The Region also provides a number of additional core services which are not required but are to be provided within budgetary constraints. These services include mental health services in jail; civil commitment prescreening, crisis intervention training and crisis prevention training. The Region has also begun to implement jail diversion services and has been working within the Region and with adjoining region to implement mobile crisis services.

We have been working closely with the CHI Behavioral Health coalition for adult and children’s services. This coalition is made up of diverse providers including teachers, adult and children’s providers, hospital staff, parent as teachers, law

enforcement and other providers and interested parties. They have been instrumental in helping develop children's services and advisory committees. Crisis intervention and other trainings continue to be provided through this coalition,

The Region worked in FY22 to transition to the state-wide crisis/warm line utilizing Your Life Iowa. This transition is expected in the first half of FY22.

The Region continues to work in 2022 to capitalize on a funding opportunity allowing for marketing efforts on a statewide scale with the goal to provide education and awareness about the MHDS regions and services. Our efforts focused on four goals. 1) Develop clear, actionable messages. 2) Create tools allowing regions to use MHDS to drive local activity. 3) Present a united front to influential, regulatory and legislative audiences. 4) Achieve a stable and consistent presence across Iowa.

Southern Hills Region had no consumer or provider appeals in FY22.

A waiting list was not needed in FY2022.
