Public Comment Period for State Plan Amendment 24-0005 Mandatory Continuous Eligibility for Children

Posted: July 28, 2024

Notice is hereby given, in accordance with 42 CFR §457.65 that the Iowa Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) will be submitting to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) State Plan Amendment (SPA) 24-0005 to address Mandatory Continuous Eligibility for Children

<u>Summary</u>

SPA 24-0005 requires Iowa to demonstrate compliance with mandatory continuous eligibility to children in CHIP and Medicaid under the Consolidated Appropriations Act (CAA) of 2023, Section 5112 of the CAA, 2023 amended section 1902(e)(12) and paragraph (K) to section 2107(e)(1) of the Act to require one year of continuous eligibility under the state plan or a waiver of the state plan for children under age 19 enrolled in Medicaid and CHIP, effective April 1, 2024.

There are three statutory exclusions that states are allowed to disenroll children from CHIP during a 12-month continuous eligibility coverage period:

- The child reaches age 19
- The child is no longer a resident in the state of Iowa
- The child becomes eligible for Medicaid

States are prohibited from disenrolling children from CHIP during a 12-month continuous eligibility coverage period due to non-payment of premiums for the Hawki program.

Effective date for this SPA is April 1, 2024.
