

Proposed Waiver Redesign

Supporting families, serving individuals across the lifespan, and serving individuals in the living situation that works best for them and their families.



Change from 7 waivers to 2, age-based waivers

Waiver 1: Children and Youth (ages 0 to 20) Waiver 2: Adult and Aging (ages 21 and older)



Offer comprehensive service packages

Include formal and informal supports that meet the needs of lowans across their lifespan



Develop "tiered" budgets

Allocate resources for eligible individuals based on their needs



Change from 7 waivers to 2 agebased waivers

Develop "tiered" budgets

- A universal assessment would assess every individual's needs and result in a level of need score.
- The score, plus other factors such as age or living arrangements, would set the monthly budget for waiver services.
- The approach would ensure lowans receive services they need in an efficient and costeffective way.

Transition from SIS-A to interRAI-ID



Transition from SIS-A to interRAI-ID

- The Iowa Intellectual Disabilities (ID) waiver uses the Supports Intensity Scale- Adult Version (SIS-A) version 1.0 to identify the supports Iowans need to live independently in the community.
- AAIDD will retire the first edition in mid-2024 but provided lowa HHS an additional 6 months to use the tool. Iowa HHS is required to discontinue use of the first edition by December 31, 2024.
- Starting in January 2025, Iowa HHS will use the interRAI Intellectual Disabilities (interRAI-ID) assessment for adult members on the ID waiver.
- During this transition, members will be placed in the same tier they had from the SIS-A assessment.

Transition from SIS-C to interRAI-CHYMH-DD

- The Iowa Intellectual Disabilities (ID) waiver uses the Supports Intensity Scale- Children's Version (SIS-C) to identify the supports children need to live and thrive in the community.
- To align with the adult transition to interRAI-ID, Iowa HHS has decided to also transition from the SIS-C to the interRAI Child and Youth Mental Health and Developmental Disability (interRAI-ChYMH-DD) assessment tool for children.
- Starting January 1, 2025, Iowa HHS will use the interRAI ChYMH-DD assessment for child members on the ID waiver.

Conducting a parallel assessment

- To make the transition, Iowa HHS needs to use the SIS and interRAI data from the same person during the same time period, to compare the results of the both assessments.
- ► This is why we call it a "parallel assessment."
- The letter to members call this an "optional assessment." Members may refuse to participate in the assessment or may end the assessment any time after it is started.

Parallel assessment of eligible members

If the member	Next action
Had an off-year assessment (OYA) in April or May 2024 that indicated <i>no change</i> from the last full SIS-A or SIS-C	Member is eligible* to participate in the parallel assessment and take the interRAI- ID or ChYMH-DD
Had an off-year assessment (OYA) in April or May 2024 that indicated a change from the last full SIS-A or SIS-C	Member is NOT eligible to participate in the parallel assessment

Eligible members will be asked to participate in an interRAI assessment in June 2024 that can be compared to a previous SIS assessment. They are not required to participate.

CMS Iowa Site Visit



CMS Iowa Site Visit

- CMS plans to conduct a site visit in Iowa the week of August 12, 2024.
- The goal of the CMS site visit is to:
 - Assess implementation of the settings criteria throughout the state's home and community-based services (HCBS) systems.
 - Assess settings previously identified as requiring heightened scrutiny review or other settings identified by the state or stakeholders as necessitating third-party review.
 - Assist the state with establishing reliable ongoing monitoring processes across residential and non-residential settings.
 - Evaluate if the state's case management and person-centered planning processes are supporting implementation of the HCBS settings criteria.

CMS Iowa Site Visit

- CMS will conduct interviews with:
 - Case Managers
 - Medicaid staff as related to operations of settings compliance
- At settings visits, CMS will:
 - Review Person-Centered Service Plans
 - Review Residency/Lease Agreements
 - Review training materials used by providers related to HCBS Settings
 - Tour the state selected setting
 - Converse with individuals receiving HCBS in the setting
 - Converse with Direct Support Staff
