If the apparent successful applicant fails to negotiate and execute a contract with the Agency, in its sole discretion, the Agency may revoke the notice and enter into contract negotiations with the next highest ranked applicant or other applicant as determined to be in the Agency's best interests or withdraw the RFA. The Agency further reserves the right to cancel the notice at any time prior to the execution of a written contract.

Applicants not listed above will not be awarded a contract pursuant to the above referenced RFA. The posting of this notice of intent to award constitutes receipt of the adverse decision. Pursuant to Section 1.15 of the RFA, applicants may appeal the adverse decision by filing a written appeal to IDPH within 10 business days of posting of the Notice of Intent to Award in accordance with 641 Iowa Administrative Code 176.8(1). An appeal shall be addressed to the contract compliance officer cited in the RFA, Department of Health and Human Services, and shall be submitted in writing via email, including a read receipt verification, to john.mcmullen@hhs.iowa.gov. Appeals must clearly and fully identify all issues being contested and demonstrate what procedures in the RFA were not followed by the Agency. In the event of an appeal, the Agency will continue working with the successful applicant(s) pending the outcome of the appeal.
