What are shortage designations?




Shortage Designations

Shortage designations help to identify areas or populations across the country that are experiencing a shortage of healthcare providers.


- ► HPSA's are delineated based on discipline and taxonomy.
- ► They are also associated with a specific geographic area, population or facility.

Types of Designations

Geographic

- Looks at the entire population of a specified area.
- Can be at a multi-county, county, sub-county or census tract level.

Population

- Looks at a subset of the population in a specified area
- The most common example is a low income HPSA which targets areas where 30% or more of the population fall into the 200% Federal Poverty Level (FPL) bracket.

Maternity Care Target Area

 Subset of existing primary care designations.

Types of Designations

Medically Underserved Area/Population (MUA/MUP)

- Only considers the primary care discipline.
- Used for the Health Centers program, RHC certification and the J1 Visa Waiver program.
- Considered legacy designations and do not require updating by HRSA.

Governor-Designated Secretary Certified Shortage Areas for Rural Health Clinics

 Only used for the purpose of certification of Rural health clinics in areas without a current Primary Care HPSA.

Automatic Facility Designations (Auto-HPSAs)

- Automatically designated as HPSAs by statute or through regulation.
- Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs) and FQHC Look-A-Likes
- ■Indian Health Facilities
- ■IHS and Tribal Hospitals
- Dual-funded Community Health Centers/Tribal Clinics
- CMS-Certified Rural Health Clinics (RHCs) that meet National Health Service Corps (NHSC) site requirements

Why do we have shortage designations?



HPSA's Provide Access to Programs

- ► HPSA's unlock access to a variety of programs that can incentivize providers to work in a specified area.
- ► Each designation is given a score which helps to further prioritize funding.

- National Health Service Corps (NHSC)
- Primary Care Provider Loan Repayment Program
- Nurse Corps
- Health Center Program
- IHS Loan Repayment Program
- Physician Health Professional Shortage Area Bonus Program
- CMS Rural Health Clinic Program
- J-1 Visa Waiver



How are areas of the state designated?



Designation Process

Health Professional Shortage Areas (HPSA's) are created by each state with approval of the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA).

Areas are analyzed at the state level Requests are submitted to HRSA through the Shortage Designation Management System, or SDMS. If approved, the area is designated and receives a score.


Designation Process

Designations are created by analyzing select variables.

Examples:

- Birth Rate
- Fluoridation Rate
- Substance and Alcohol Use
- Federal Poverty Rate


How to locate your HPSA Score



HPSA Find

Search HPSA data by state and county (or counties). HPSA Find provides the type of HPSA (geographic, population, or facility-based), score, HPSA type, and other details. The tool allows users to filter, sort, and export the results.

Search HPSAs by State/County



Find Shortage Areas by Address

Enter an address to determine if it is in a shortage area: Geographic or Population HPSA or MUA/P and the details about that shortage area. Results can be viewed as text or on a map.
