## **Project Update**

#### Iowa Child Care Shared Services

August 2024

#### **BACKGROUND**

The Iowa Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) is implementing a multi-phase Shared Services project. This work is in response to the <u>Governor's Child Care Task</u> Force Report (November 2021).

The multi-phase Shared Services project includes:

- Funding providers' monthly child care management system (CCMS) software license fees for either brightwheel or Playground;
- Financial management coaching to help providers use data collected in the CCMS system to monitor and manage their programs;
- Technology grants to support providers' implementation of brightwheel or Playground;
- 'Data bridges' to connect CCMS data to KinderTrack (KT) and other data systems through Child Care Connect (C3);;
- Online tools powered by data in C3 to help families find child care and child care programs fill vacancies faster and provide data-informed insights about child care services available in communities.

## Launch of New Child Care Tools Powered by C3

In past Shared Services Project updates, information was shared about Iowa State University building and maintaining a secure, centralized operational data store (ODS).

The ODS moves specific data in and out of multiple sources. Iowa's operational data store is called "Iowa Child Care Connect" or "C3." C3 powers new online child care tools, a Child Care Search and Child Care Data Dashboards. Learn more about C3 click here.

#### Child Care Search

The Child Care Search is a new, easy-to-use online tool now available to help

families find openings in child care programs based on their route to work or school. Filters can narrow down a search based on the ages of children needing care, whether the program is located in a home or child care center, accepts Child Care Assistance (CCA), participates in the Iowa Quality for Kids (IQ4K®)



Program, etc. Use the Child Care Search on a mobile phone or computer to search for child care and see results.




The green map pin indicates a child care program has openings.

Not just parents benefit from this new tool. Child care programs benefit from the Child Care Search because it is a free marketing tool to identify open child care slots in their program, potentially filling slots faster and increasing revenue. Employers and HR staff can use this new tool as a recruitment strategy with a potential employee to showcase available child care options in the community.

#### **Child Care Data Dashboards**

Understanding the current supply and demand for child care services is challenging when comprehensive data about available care, provider capacities, and family needs is not readily available. The launch of lowa's new Child Care Data Dashboards delivers near real-time data with customizable filters to allows users to filter by child age group, program type, city, and county. Users are able to view the data on the number of child care slots

available in programs participating in the lowa Quality for Kids (IQ4K®) Program or those accepting children on the Child Care Assistance (CCA) Program. A review of child care supply and demand regionally can be performed by selecting multiple counties and cities within a region. Data trends to aid with strategic planning is an additional resource available.

## Business Coaching Through CCCI Paired with State-funded CCMS License Subscriptions

Hundreds of lowa child care programs, both small and large, child development homes and child care centers, have taken advantage of



financial management coaching through the Child Care Collaborative of Iowa (CCCI) and state-funded CCMS license subscriptions for either Playground or brightwheel. Participating programs are also eligible for a technology grant to help support the implementation of either brightwheel or Playground.

Why is HHS pairing CCMS software with a financial management coach? The coach not only helps providers in learning to use the CCMS software, but also in analyzing the data in the system to improve business practices. The coach supports providers for a full year to identify and realize business goals around budgeting, cash flow, financial reporting, marketing, profitability, staff compensation, growth, debt, and other key metrics.

# **Extension of State-funded CCMS Licenses**

HHS is extending state-funded monthly CCMS license subscriptions for brightwheel and Playground through June 30, 2025. A robust CCMS helps child care providers easily manage key business operations accurately and quickly like, enrollment tracking, invoicing, fee collection, family communication, HHS compliance, and more. Implementing a CCMS to support child care businesses is a gamechanger, whether it is a home-based provider caring for six (6) children or a child care center caring for 160

### Process for Additional CCMS Vendors to Connect to C3

HHS is developing an application and approval process for additional child care management system (CCMS) software vendors to connect to C3. HHS anticipates this process will be posted on HHS's website in September.

NOTE: HHS is NOT funding additional CCMS vendors for provider license subscriptions or the vendor's costs associated with connecting to C3.
