



Patient Eligibility Screening Record for Adults (19+ Years)

At each immunization visit, determine if patients are eligible for routinely recommended vaccines through the Vaccines for Adults Program (VFA). Screening records reflecting the status of adults participating in the VFA program must be kept for a minimum of three years.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Eligible for VFA vaccines if at least 19 years of age and

1. Uninsured – Has no health insurance
2. Underinsured – Has insurance that does not cover vaccines (eligible only for the specific vaccine(s) that insurance does not cover), caps prevention services (eligible after cap is reached), or does not provide first-dollar coverage for vaccines (first-dollar means coverage of ACIP recommended vaccines without cost sharing to the patient)

Eligible for certain VFA vaccines if at least 19 years of age and

3. Has Medicare Part B, but *not* Part D – Patient is considered underinsured for all ACIP-recommended vaccines not covered under Part B¹

Not Eligible for VFA Vaccines

- Patient has private insurance or Medicaid
- Patient is an Iowa Health Link Member or is receiving Medicaid coverage through a fee-for-service model (Iowa Medicaid)
- Patient has Medicare Part D
