This chapter provides rules to implement the PROMISE JOBS program as required by Federal law for Iowa to receive TANF dollars. PROMISE JOBS provides employment and training services to FIP families, to assist these families in gaining financial stability.

In SFY23, PJ served a total of 21,280 families. This count is not unduplicated, meaning the same family may be counted in each month in the SFY. Also in SFY23, PJ supportive expense payments (including child care) were made in the amount of \$2,414,054.
