Local Public Health Services (LPHS) A Population Health Focus

Contract Framework

The Local Public Health Services (LPHS) contract provides funding to Local Boards of Health for the delivery of population health activities and nonpopulation health services within the jurisdiction of the Board of Health.

Population health refers to the health outcomes within a group of people where as non-population health refers to considering the health of one person at a time.

In order to advance population health within every lowa county, the LPHS contract was redesigned in Fiscal Year 2023 (FY23) to initiate the dedicated use of LPHS funds towards the Public Health System Areas of Work. The required areas of work are leadership and governance; health promotion; and strengthening local public health infrastructure. Required Areas of Work (Population Health Activities)



Future Utilization of Funds

The staff of the HHS Bureau of Environmental and Local Public Health along with the local public health agencies are working together to advance population health at a systems level by incrementally transitioning the use of LPHS funds from non-population health services to 100% use of funds for population health activities by FY27.

How Did We Do in FY24?

55 counties used 100% of FY24 LPHS funds for population health.



\$6.28 million (82%) of FY24 LPHS funds were used for population health.



63 counties Plan to use 100% of LPHS funds for population health in FY25.

An increase of 9 counties

using 100% of FY24 LPHS funds for population health as compared to 46 counties in FY23

An increase of \$560,000 (9.8%) use of FY24 LPHS funds for population

health compared to the 5.72 million used for population health in FY23.

An increase of 8 counties

planning to use 100% of FY25 LPHS funds for population health as compared to FY24.
