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Pursuant to the provisions of Iowa Code Sections 17A.18 and 147A.7, and Iowa Administrative Code (I.A.C.) 641—131.7, the Iowa Department of Public Health is proposing to place the emergency medical care provider certification identified above on **PROBATION** for a period of one year from the effective date of this notice.

The Department may place an EMS provider on probation when it finds that the applicant or certificate holder has committed any of the following acts or offenses:

*Professional Incompetency. Professional Incompetency includes, but is not limited to:*

- (1) A substantial lack of knowledge or ability to discharge professional obligations within the scope of practice.*
- (2) A substantial deviation from the standards of learning or skill ordinarily possessed and applied by other emergency medical care providers in the state of Iowa acting in the same or similar circumstances.*
- (3) A failure to exercise the degree of care which is ordinarily exercised by the average emergency medical care provider acting in the same or similar circumstances.*
- (4) Failure to conform to the minimal standard of acceptable and prevailing practice of certified emergency medical care providers in this state. IAC 641-131.7(3)e(1-4).*

*Knowingly making misleading, deceptive, untrue or fraudulent representations in the practice of the profession or engaging in unethical conduct or practice harmful or detrimental to the public. Proof of actual injury need not be established. Acts which may constitute unethical conduct include, but are not limited to:*

- (5) Falsification of medical records IAC 641—131.7(3)f(5).*

The following events have led to this notice:

On December 13, 2016 you were primary attendant to a patient on a medical call for service. An EMT completed a patient care report for that medical call for service. The description of the patient's condition in the patient care report is not consistent with your verbal explanation of the incident or the patient's actual condition.

Additionally, the Department's peer review process indicates the care and documentation you provided in December of 2016 constitutes professional incompetency. You failed to act as another EMS provider would have in the same situation and you did not follow typical EMS protocol in the treatment of the patient or documentation of the incident.

Your probation shall be subject to the following terms and conditions:

- a. You shall successfully complete one hour of continuing education in the area of Documentation based on the National Emergency Medical Services Education Standards for the EMT level during the period of probation. Prior to attending a course, you shall submit the proposed course name and course syllabus. These hours shall be in addition to those required for renewal of your certification. You are responsible for all costs associated with this requirement.
- b. You shall successfully complete two hours of continuing education in the area of Clinical Behavior/Judgment: Decision Making based on the National Emergency Medical Services Education Standards for the EMT level during the period of probation. Prior to attending a course, you shall submit the proposed course name and course syllabus. These hours shall be in addition to those required for renewal of your certification. You are responsible for all costs associated with this requirement.
- c. You shall submit quarterly reports to the Department (filed no later than January 10, April 10, July 10, and October 10) which shall include the following information:
  - i. The time period covered by the report
  - ii. Verification that you have complied with the terms of probation as specified in this Notice.
- d. You shall make a personal appearance before the Department upon request. You shall be given reasonable notice of the date, time, and place of appearance.
- e. You shall obey all federal, state, and local statutes and rules governing the provisions of emergency medical services.
- f. You shall notify any current or prospective employer, to include direct supervisors, service directors and medical directors, of the terms, conditions and restrictions imposed by this notice. Within fifteen days of this notice taking effect, or of undertaking new employment, your direct supervisor, service director and medical director shall report to the Department, in writing, acknowledging that the employer and medical director have read this document and understands it.
- g. You shall notify any EMS training program you enroll in for courses leading to certification or endorsement of the reasons for this probation. Within fifteen days of this notice taking effect, or entering an EMS training program, the training program director and medical director shall report to the bureau, in writing, acknowledging that the training program and medical director have read this document and understands it.
- h. You shall notify the bureau of any change in address within one week of said change.
- i. In the event you violate or fail to comply with any of the terms or provisions of your probation, the department may initiate appropriate action to revoke or suspend your certification or to impose other appropriate discipline.
- j. This Notice shall be part of the permanent record of the Department and shall be considered by the bureau in determining the nature and severity of any disciplinary action to be imposed in the event of future violations.
