Maternity Incentive Program Overview

Objective	Enhance communication with pregnant members through provider interaction to ensure a healthy pregnancy.
Goal	Identify pregnancies as early as possible, decreasing barriers to prenatal/ postpartum healthcare, and improving maternal and neonatal birth outcomes.
Member Attribution	Iowa Total Care members.
Member Attribution	Providers within Iowa Total Care network.
Performance Incentive	Up to \$150 per member, per pregnancy • Up to \$100 for NOP Form and \$50 for PPC Coding Incentive
Payout	Incentives will be paid in combination of quarterly payments and through claims.





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Notification of Pregnancy (NOP)

The NOP form identifies pregnant members and their risk factors as early in pregnancy as possible. Receipt of an NOP form automatically enrolls a pregnant member in the Start Smart for Your Baby[®] (SSFB) program.

Need to submit a NOP form? There are 2 ways to complete

- Use the <u>Provider Portal</u> (provider.iowatotalcare.com)
 - Under Assessments tab select SSFB WEB ONLY NOP V2 to complete the form

OR

 Fax the NOP form (located on the <u>Manuals, Forms and Resources webpage</u>) to 1-833-257-8323. (iowatotalcare.com/providers/resources/forms-resources.html).

NOP Form

- Submit at the confirmation of pregnancy appointment or first OB.
 - Reporting member's pregnancy within the first 12 weeks of pregnancy meets the HEDIS[®] measure.
 - HEDIS Measure:
 - **Timeliness of Prenatal Care:** percentage of deliveries that received a prenatal care visit in the first trimester, on or before the enrollment start date or within 42 days of enrollment in the organization.









NOP Form Provider Incentive

- During initial pregnancy visit or at a confirmation of pregnancy appt, with an Iowa Total Care member, complete Iowa Total Care's NOP form.
- Once the NOP form is completed fully, submit to:
 - Iowa Total Care <u>Provider Portal</u>. (provider.iowatotalcare.com)
 - Fax: 1-833-257-8323.
- Submitted forms *must* be accurate and complete.
- Iowa Total Care will closely monitor the number of completed NOP forms submitted to calculate payment.
- Incentives will be paid retrospectively on a quarterly basis.
- Once you have reported that your patient is pregnant, contact the Iowa HHS Income Maintenance Customer Service Center at 1-877-347-5678 to report this change for Medicaid.
 - Provide them with the patient's confirmed due date.

NOP Analysis Outcomes

Due to global billing in Iowa for obstetrics (OB) care, Iowa Total Care is not aware that a member may be pregnant, thus missing out on important benefits like care management support for important resources, assistance with transportation, or any other concerns or difficulties an individual may face during pregnancy.


Early submission of a NOP form alerts our SSFB case management team that a member is pregnant.

Iowa Total Care can show statistically that the earlier we are aware a member is pregnant, the larger the impact our SSFB team can have.

When an NOP form is submitted a member has a 4% reduction in neonate rate, and a 3% decrease in

neonatal intensive care unit (NICU) admissions.

Provider Pregnancy Coding Incentive

- Iowa Total Care is offering a \$50 provider coding incentive for an initial prenatal visit!
- To receive the incentive, claims must be submitted with the appropriate CPT[®] Category II (CPT II) code identifying the initial prenatal visit.
- This incentive payment is in addition to your current contract rate.
 - When billing, must **add** the \$50 to your total claim requested amount.
- Incentive payments are made at the time of claims payment.
- This CPT II code can be done on the date of the first prenatal visit, on a lab/ultrasound, or on the same claim as the global maternity billing.
- If a provider submits CPT II code more than once on a member, it will be denied at the claims level because the service is already met. The rest of the claim will still be processed and paid.
 - CPT II code may be used once per member per 6 months.

* For providers that bill the global OB antepartum package CPT codes 59425 or 59426, CPT Category II codes 0500F or 0501F will be required in addition to the global codes. Providers will only be paid once per member per pregnancy for this CPT II code, within a 6-month period. If Iowa Total Care receives multiple claims with the CPT II code, CPT II code incentive will not be paid on subsequent claims.

The prenatal care visit must include **one** of the following pieces of documentation indicating the member is pregnant or references to the pregnancy. For example:

- Documentation in a standardized prenatal flow sheet, or
- Documentation of LMP, estimated due date, or gestational age, or
- A positive pregnancy test result, or

- Documentation of gravidity and parity, or
- Documentation of complete obstetrical history, or
- Documentation of prenatal risk assessment and counseling/education

Documentation by a registered nurse alone *does not* meet compliance requirements for HEDIS.




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PPC Coding Analysis Outcome

- ✓ ITC identified 1691 distinct member pregnancies
- ✓ MY24 TOPC: 81.29% of members identified within the PPC Coding Cumulative Report are compliant.







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Start Smart for Your Baby (SSFB)

The SSFB program promotes education and communication between pregnant members and our case managers to ensure healthy pregnancies and healthy babies through their first year of life.

Babies admitted to the NICU are assessed and, if needed, assigned to a care manager who specializes in NICU babies.

Identification & Stratification	 Early identification and assessment of risk factors. Risk stratification identifying impactable and at-risk members. 	
Management	 Development of a plan of care. Active care coordination. Link to services and support. 	
Evaluation	 Ongoing monitoring and revision of the plan of care. Continuity of care, follow-up, documentation, and measurement.

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What Is Our Doula Program?

Our Doula Pilot Program is an Iowa Total Care program **providing birthing people with culturally sensitive doula care**. The program was launched in 2022, and is working to improve maternal health outcomes, especially in pregnant and birthing people of color.

The Doula Pilot Program targets several issues in maternal care, such as:

• Low birth weight outcomes.

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- Lack of early and regular prenatal care throughout pregnancy.
- Lack of postpartum visits.

We hope to ease the burden of access to maternal care, address cultural barriers, and improve maternal and infant health outcomes. For the pilot in 2022, any pregnant member living in **Polk, Johnson, or Muscatine counties** is eligible for doula care, regardless of race.

How did we select locations?

- For the first pilot period, Iowa Total Care selected counties in which there was a higher than average low birth weight outcome.
- We also took into consideration whether the identified counties had practicing doulas that could be recruited for the program.



Doula Program: Impact Summary

For the pilot (2022-2024), any pregnant member living in **Polk, Johnson, or Muscatine counties** was eligible for doula care, regardless of race.

What's Next?

Iowa Total Care expanded to phase two for FY 2024/2025.

The expansion includes:

- 90 additional births.
- Expanded to add three more counties:
 - Black Hawk
 - Scott
 - Woodbury
- Recruitment of additional doulas.

Data through Dec 2024

- 11 members enrolled to receive doula care
- 2 births this year, both were vaginal births and health babies
- 6 upcoming births for 2025 are already enrolled!

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My Health Pays® Rewards

Healthy activities eligible for rewards include:

- First Trimester Prenatal Visit
 - Must complete within first 12 weeks of pregnancy.
 - Reward: \$40.
- Notification of Pregnancy Form
 - Must complete within first trimester for \$20 or in the second trimester for \$15.
 - Reward: Up to \$20.
- Postpartum Doctor Visit
 - 1–12 weeks after delivery.
 - Reward: \$20.

How can members use My Health Pays Rewards?

Members can earn rewards at Walmart and Hy-Vee to purchase everyday items*. My Health Pays rewards can also be used to help members pay for:

- Childcare services.
- Education

• Transportation.

Telecommunications.

- Rent.
- Utilities.

*Rewards may not be used to buy alcohol, tobacco, firearms products, lottery tickets, gift cards, or for cash.
