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
Pertussis Background

Respiratory bacterial infection, also known as "whooping cough"

- Characterized by severe, paroxysmal (fitful) coughing attacks that end in a "whooping" sound
- Spread through contact with respiratory droplets
 - Highly contagious, 80-90% secondary attack rate in household contacts
- Treatment with antibiotics is recommended for people infected, for symptomatic contacts, and for high-risk contacts to prevent illness
- Most effective protection is DTaP and TDaP vaccines




Pertussis Disease Progression





Iowa Response

- ► LPH investigates cases and identify close contacts
- Cases are interviewed to determine symptoms, treatment, exposures, vaccination status, as well as given recommendations for isolation
 - Asymptomatic high-risk contacts are recommended post exposure prophylaxis
 - Symptomatic contacts are investigated and provided recommendations on isolation and treatment
