Resilience through Integrated Systems and Excellence

A specialized managed care program for youth with complex behavioral health and multisystem needs

Specialized Managed Care Plan

Aetna Better Health of Ohio serves as the single statewide specialized managed care plan.

Shared Governance

OhioRISE features multi-agency governance to drive toward improving crosssystem outcomes – we all serve many of the same children, youth, and families.

Coordinated and Integrated Care & Services

OhioRISE brings together local entities, schools, providers, health plans, and families as part of our approach for improving care for enrolled children and youth.

Prevent Custody Relinquishment

OhioRISE's 1915(c) waiver targets the most in need and vulnerable families and children to prevent custody relinquishment.

OhioRISE Eligibility

Children and youth who may be eligible for OhioRISE:

- Are eligible for Ohio Medicaid (either managed care or fee for service),
- Are age 0-20, and
- Require significant behavioral health treatment needs, measured using the Ohio Child and Adolescent Needs and Strengths (CANS) assessment or a recent inpatient behavioral health hospital/psychiatric residential treatment facility admission.

OhioRISE Services

 All existing behavioral health services – with a few limited exceptions (behavioral health emergency dept.)

- Intensive and Moderate Care Coordination NEW
- Intensive Home-Based Treatment (IHBT) ENHANCED
- Psychiatric Residential Treatment Facilities (PRTF) NEW
- Behavioral health respite ENHANCED
- Flex funds to support implementing a care plan NEW
- 1915(c) waiver that runs through OhioRISE NEW
 - Unique waiver services & eligibility
- Mobile Response and Stabilization Service (MRSS) NEW
 - Also covered outside of OhioRISE (managed care or fee for service)

The program provides access to an evidence-informed model of intensive care coordination and additional home and community-based services. A Behavioral Health Decision Support Model is used to help identify youth who might benefit from the Pathways to Success program. Pathways to Success Member Communications

For Families



Pathways to Success is a program for Medicaid enrolled children under the age of 21 in Illinois who have complex behavioral health needs and require intensive home and community based services. The program provides access to two tiers of care coordination including:

- Tier 1 High Fidelity Wraparound for children and youth with the most complex behavioral health needs.
- Tier 2 Intensive Care Coordination for children and youth with complex behavioral health needs.

The Pathways to Success program also covers additional services that can be provided in the youth's home and community including: Intensive Home-Based Services, Family Peer Support, Therapeutic Mentoring and Respite. To determine which youth are eligible for the Pathways to Success program and to ensure that they are receiving the most appropriate tier of care coordination, a Behavioral Health Decision Support Model is utilized. A description of the Behavioral Health Decision Support Model can be reviewed <u>here</u>.

If you believe you or your child may be eligible for Pathways to Success, please submit a copy of the **Request for Eligibility Determination form** and a copy of your IM+CANS to the Bureau of Behavioral Health at the contact information on the form. Bureau of Behavioral Health will review your request and IM+CANS to determine eligibility for Pathways to Success.

What is Pathways to Success?

Pathways to Success is a new program that offers additional home and community-based options for you and your family. Pathways to Success is here to help your family with areas of conflict or crisis while also keeping your child and family together at home.

Pathways to Success

High-Fidelity Wraparound & Intensive Care Coordination

A family-driven approach to providing care where a Facilitator partners with you and your family to identify what you want your family to look like and how to get there. This process includes your family choosing a team, that could include family, friends, neighbors, and/or service providers. As a team, everyone works to find creative ideas and solutions that fit the style of your unique family. If your family chooses to participate in either of these services, the following services can be offered as part of the Pathways to Success program.

Intensive Home-Based

A team comes to your home to explore the root of ongoing crisis and build skills that you and your family choose to help your child succeed.

Therapeutic Support Services

Specialized therapy methods and services for your family. Some examples could include art, dance, or music therapy.

Individual Support Services

Activities, services, and goods that support health and wellness for your family. Some examples could include music lessons; programs for youth who require special accommodations including fitness, recreation or sports; and/or weighted blankets.

Family Peer Support

Caregivers with lived experience and/or similar family experiences provide support to you as a caregiver while you navigate your family's journey to change.

Therapeutic Mentoring

Your child and a mentor work one-on-one in the home or community to develop skills that you and your family choose.

Respite

When your family needs a break, a trusted professional can spend time with your child at home or in the community.



Child & Family Teaming

PROVIDER ASSISTANCE

What is the Child & Family Team?

The Child and Family Team is a group of people **you choose** that meet regularly and work together to support you.

Your Wraparound Care Coordinator will support you in identifying the important people in your life and inviting them to join the Child and Family Team.

What is the purpose of the Child & Family Team?

The purpose of the Child and Family Team is to bring together the important people in your life in order to share their unique perspective on your family. The Child and Family Team provides a time and place for everyone to meet as one team to provide support to your family.

Who is included in the Child & Family Team?

The Child and Family Team can include professionals who make you feel supported, for example, a therapist, school staff, and/or probation officer. In addition, the team can include other supports in your life, such as family members, friends, coaches, church members, and/or a neighbor.

Your team will include a combination of:

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- Family Members (e.g., aunt, grandparent, sibling)
- · Formal Supports (e.g., therapist, probation officer, teacher)
- Informal Supports (e.g., neighbor, coach, pastor)

Your Care Coordinator can answer any questions about building your Child & Family Team and how the team can help your family meet the goals you have created.




