Provider Payment Updates

Implementation Transition Period

Through an implementation transition period, HHS will honor continuity of care for any non-Medicaid Long-Term Supports and Services (LTSS) approved by the MHDS Regions prior to July 1 and pay related claims.

Transition Period



During the transition period, DAP service coordinators will review and update service plans to create service approvals beyond the transition period.



Ongoing service plans and approvals will align with regular eligibility reviews.



Safety Net Management Information System (SNMIS)

What is SNMIS?

- ► Claims payment system for safety net services for both Behavioral Health and Disability Services.
- ► Works like fee-forservice Medicaid claims payment system but, used for fee schedule payments for safety net services.

Who will use SNMIS?

- ► Billable services only.
- ► Medicaid Enrolled Providers in good standing.
- ► Able to submit electronic claims and accept electronic payment.

How Are Claims Paid?

Iowa HHS will publish fee schedules for all safety-net services reimbursed via SNMIS.
