Care Planning Approach

Settlement Agreement

- A **single consistent care coordinator** will facilitate development of a Care Planning Team (CPT) and cross system involvement.
- The care coordinator will work directly with the child, the family, and others significant to the child to **identify strengths and needs** of the child and family, and to **develop a plan** for meeting those needs and goals.

Design Question

- How different is this description from care planning that currently happens?
- Is the described role for the care coordinator similar or different from roles today?

Care Planning Approach

Settlement Agreement

- The CPT will bring together individuals selected by the child and family who are committed to them through **informal, formal, and community support and service relationships.**



Design Question

- Who do care coordinators currently engage in the care planning process?
- Is the care planning team similar to anything that exists in Iowa?

Care Planning Approach

Settlement Agreement

- The CPT will develop a **child-guided and family-driven Person-Centered Plan** (PCP) that specifies the goals and actions to address the medical, educational, social, mental health, and other services needed by the child and family.



Design Question

- How similar is this description to the typical process for creating a care plan?
- Are there any care planning processes in place that support the creation of a Person-Centered Plan?

Referral Approach

Settlement Agreement

- Care coordinators will work directly with the child and family to **implement elements of the PCP**.
- Care coordinators must **organize and match care across providers and child-serving systems** to allow the child to be served in the home and community.



Design Question

- How similar is this description to the referral services care coordinators already provide?
- How could the state support care coordinators to meet this requirement in the Iowa context?

Monitoring Approach

Design Question

- Care coordinator will **prepare, monitor, and modify the PCP** in concert with the CPT and determines:
 - **Whether services are being provided** in accordance with the PCP.
 - Whether services in the PCP are **adequate**.
 - Whether there are **changes in the needs or status of the child** and, if so, adjusts the PCP as necessary, in concert with the CPT.
- Care coordinator will actively assist the child and family to **obtain and monitor the delivery of available services**, including medical, behavioral health, social, therapeutic, and other services.

- How different is this description from care monitoring that currently happens?
- Is the described role for the care coordinator similar to or different from roles that exist today?
