Programmatic Updates & Reminders



Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) – April 15–16 Meeting

- ACIP voted unanimously (15 YES 0 NO) and passed the following pediatric recommendation:
- ACIP recommends GSK's MenABCWY vaccine (PENMENVY) may be used when both MenACWY and MenB are indicated at the same visit
 - Healthy person aged 16-23 (routine schedule) when shared clinical decision-making favors administration of MenB vaccine and
 - Persons aged ≥10 years who are at increased risk for meningococcal disease (e.g. because of persistent complement deficiencies, complement inhibitor use, or functional or anatomic asplenia)

ACIP - April 15- 16 Meeting

- VFC Vote: Approve the updated Vaccines for Children (VFC) resolution for vaccines to prevent meningococcal disease
- Penmenvy is not yet available to VFC Program providers
 - Iowa VFC Program will notify providers when it is available
- Penbraya is the only MenABCWY product currently available through the VFC program
 - Existing inventory of Penbraya should continue to be administered according to ACIP recommendations

Upcoming Delivery Holds

- Deliveries made by UPS & FedEx
- Review and update delivery hours with each order
 - Required to have at least one four-hour consecutive period on a day other than a Monday to receive shipments
 - Hours do not update in IRIS unless included on a submitted order
- Upcoming delivery holds this quarter:
 - May 23 and 26
 - June 19
 - July 3, 4 and 7
 - August 29 and September 1
- McKesson may place temporary holds due to severe weather conditions in Iowa or at the warehouse site

TagAlert Temperature Monitors in Refrigerated Coolers

- New temperature monitors (TagAlert) in shipments from McKesson
- TagAlert temperature monitors should be discarded and do not need to be returned to McKesson
- Each shipment includes a flyer with unpacking steps, TagAlert instructions, and cooler return instructions to assist staff responsible for receiving vaccine shipments



Action item: Upon opening the box, providers should **IMMEDIATELY press the blue Stop and Start Button** until the Stop Icon appears and then read the indicator status to determine if the appropriate temperature was maintained during transit



McKesson Vaccine Coolers

► Two types of qualified coolers are used:

- EcoFlex96 reusable coolers are sent with all frozen and most medium, large, and extra-large refrigerated vaccine
- KoolTemp coolers for most small refrigerated shipments

Action item:

- Refer to flyer provided in each cooler about whether and how to return the cooler for recycling/re-use
- Return all EcoFlex shippers and discard KoolTemp Cooler
- ► Do not included non-viable vaccines in these returns

2024-2025 Respiratory Season Updates



RSV products – hold for next season

Providers with Nirsevimab or Abrysvo (maternal RSV vaccine) inventory on hand should store doses for next season

Do not waste or spoil these products

Action Item: Labeled immunizations as "Keep for Fall" and stored appropriately for next season

Reduction of RSV-Associated Hospitalizations in 24-25 Season

RSV hospitalization rates during the 2024-25 season were 45-52% lower in infants younger than 3 months old and 28-43% lower in infants younger than 8 months old compared to the 2018-2020 seasons

Return Flu Vaccines

Seasonal influenza VFC vaccines are set to expire on June 30, 2025.
 Viable but unused vaccines cannot be returned until expiry date
 VFC Providers are expected to return all spoiled and expired VFC
 vaccines as soon as possible within the first 30 days but not to exceed six months after expiration date

- Return single dose syringes, unopened single dose vials, and unopened multi-dose vials to McKesson
- Products in open boxes can be returned

Nonviable Vaccine Return Instructions: IRIS contains functionality to manage nonviable vaccine returns, including notifications prompting providers to return nonviable VFC vaccines to McKesson

 All McKesson return label communications will come from UPS Quantum View <u>pkginfo@ups.com</u>



Return COVID-19 Vaccines

►VFC Providers are expected to return **all spoiled and expired VFC vaccines**, including 2024-2025 COVID-19 vaccines, as soon as possible within the first 30 days but not to exceed six months after expiration date

- Return single dose syringes, unopened single dose vials, and unopened multi-dose vials to McKesson
- Products in open boxes can be returned, however opened
- multi-dose vials cannot be returned
- Shipping label is only valid for 30 days

Trivalent Influenza Vaccine Composition for the 2025-26 season

- On March 13, 2025, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) recommended trivalent 2025-2026 influenza vaccines contain:
 - A/Victoria/4897/2022 (egg-based) & A/Wisconsin/67/2022 (cell/recombinant-based) (H1N1) pdm09-like virus
 - A/Croatia/10136RV/2023 (egg-based) & A/District of Columbia/27/2023 (cell/recombinant-based) (H3N2)-like virus
 - B/Austria/1359417/2021 (B/Victoria lineage)-like virus.

WA Health and Human Services

FluMist- Self/Caregiver Administrations Program

- AstraZeneca will launch FluMist with a self/ caregiver administration option for the 25-26 flu season
 - FluMist self/caregiver option will only be available through an online pharmacy
 FluMist will continue to be available for administration by a healthcare provider
- FluMist prebooked through lowa HHS cannot be self/caregiver administered and <u>must be administered for in-office use</u>
 - CDC flu contracts with AstraZeneca for the 2025-26 season will not provide the option for self/caregiver administered vaccine



COVID-19 Vaccine Strains

- On May 22, 2025, the FDA's Vaccines and Related Biological Products Advisory Committee will meet in open session to discuss and make recommendations on the selection of the 2025-2026 Formula for COVID-19 vaccines for use in the United States

RSV Products & COVID-19 Vaccine VFC Policy Changes

- Since the fall of 2023, VFC providers have been granted a flexible, time-limited period to meet the private inventory requirements for COVID-19 vaccines and RSV monoclonal antibody products
- During this period, VFC providers have not been required to maintain the minimum private inventory for these products
- ► For 2025-26 season, the Iowa VFC Operations Guide will be updated with the following two policy changes

2025-26 RSV Monoclonal Antibody Products VFC Policy

► VFC Providers that serve and plan to vaccinate any privately insured, non-VFC eligible population, must maintain a separate vaccine inventory to vaccinate their non-VFC-eligible population

Starting July 1, 2025, this policy will include nirsevimab and any other RSV monoclonal antibody product that may be added to the VFC program

- VFC Provider locations that stock private nirsevimab should plan to stock VFC nirsevimab
- Routine borrowing of VFC vaccines and monoclonal antibody products for use among privately insured, non-VFC-eligible patients is not permitted

2025-26 COVID-19 Vaccines VFC Policy

- Given the unique considerations of COVID-19 vaccination, it may not be practical for all VFC providers to stock this vaccine for VFC-eligible patients
- As such, the Iowa VFC Program will identify accessible locations where VFC-eligible children can be referred for COVID-19 vaccination
 - Locations and additional information will be communicated to VFC Providers
 - VFC Program providers are still encouraged to carry COVID-19 vaccines to vaccinate their patient populations

Anticipated* Upcoming Respiratory Season Summary

Influenza Vaccine:

- Will ship as soon as received in CDC warehouse
- Allocation model from CDC may not receive all prebooked doses at once

► COVID-19 Vaccine:

- Ordering to start in fall (TBD)
- More information from FDA May 22nd meeting
- Anticipate allocation model from CDC

Maternal RSV Vaccine:

- Ordering to start in August, can use unexpired vaccine from previous seasons
- Administration to start September 1
- Anticipate allocation model from CDC

Nirsevimab (RSV) infant product:

- Ordering to start in September, can use unexpired vaccine from previous seasons
- Administration to start October 1
- Anticipate allocation model from CDC

Keeps It That Way Campaign

- 1. VFC Staff Training & Clinic Contacts
- 2. Back-up DDL has a current and valid Certificate of calibration testing
- 3. Temperature Monitoring Data Recording & Review
- 4. Vaccine Management Plan review

1) Key Staff Training

Requirement: Primary & Back-up vaccine coordinators required to complete two You Call the Shots Modules

- Vaccines For Children (VFC)
- Vaccine Storage and Handling

Action Steps:

- Ensure Primary & Back-up vaccine coordinators complete trainings
- Other clinic staff can complete the trainings, but not required

1) Key Staff have IRIS Admin Access

Recommendation:

Primary & Back-up vaccine coordinators recommended to have IRIS Admin Access to complete VFC related activities

Action Step:

- Verify IRIS Admin Access
- Complete <u>IRIS Authorized Site Agreement-Organization</u> if primary or back-up coordinators do not have IRIS Admin Access

1) Updated Key Staff Contacts

Requirement: All changes in key staff must be communicated to Iowa Immunization Program

- IRIS Admin users can update Edit Organization Page
 - Primary, back-up, and vaccine delivery contacts

Action Steps:

Review contacts in IRIS Edit Organization page

1) Clinic Status Changes Must Be Reported

Clinic Status Reporting Requirement:

- VFC providers must communicate clinic status changes to the Iowa VFC Program, including, but not limited to:
 - Permanent closures
 - Temporary closures
 - Moving locations
 - Anything that would affect delivery, storage or monitoring VFC vaccine

Action Steps:

Send email to <u>lowaVFC@hhs.iowa.gov</u> before clinic changes occur

2) Access to a Back-up DDL

► Requirement:

- Iowa VFC providers shall have at least one back-up DDL, meeting VFC requirements with a valid and current certificate of calibration readily available
 - Back-up device is recommended to have a different calibration expiration date from the primary DDL
 - If the back-up device is not physically on-site, a plan must be in place documenting how the back-up device will be accessed within an acceptable timeframe

Action item: Ensure VFC Provider location has access to a back-up DDL



2) Ordering Replacement DDLs

- Immunization Program has Log Tag 400s available to VFC Providers at no cost
- Send email request to <u>lowaVFC@hhs.iowa.gov</u> containing:
 - VFC PIN
 - Number of refrigerator DDLs requested
 - Number of freezer DDLs requested
 - If a docking station is needed

3) Temperature Documentation

► Requirement:

- Storage unit(s) current temperatures are checked and recorded on a temperature log twice daily (at the start and end of the workday) along with staff initials and time of readings
- Storage unit(s) minimum and maximum temperatures are checked and recorded on a temperature log at the start of each work day along with staff initials and time of reading

► Action Step:

- Designated staff must check and record temperatures twice daily (at the beginning and end of each day) and min/max at start of day
- Ensure recordings capture staff initials/name and time of reading

3) Temperature Documentation – cont

► Requirement:

- Storage temperature logs are maintained for at least 3 years for each unit either in electronic or paper format
- The designated person reviews temperature logs at least weekly to ensure proper temperature recording and takes action if out of range temperatures are found on the logs during review
- The data logger is downloaded and reviewed at least every two weeks and whenever the data logger alarms

4) VFC Storage & Handling Plan

► Requirement:

- Vaccine S&H Plan must be reviewed, signed, and updated at least annually
- Updated changes in standard operating procedures
 - Whenever S&H recommendations of vaccines are updated
 - New vaccines are added to inventory
- Update when change in staff that has responsibilities specified in the plan
- Update review date and signature on document

Action Step: Review clinic S&H Plan today with all immunization staff
