## REACH Engagement



#### REACH Engagement Goals

- Starting in September 2025, HHS reach out to groups across lowa to:
  - Educate groups about changes from REACH
  - Collect stakeholder feedback
  - Foster continued community engagement with REACH
- ► We want to ensure that discussions are mutually beneficial and help rebuild trust in our youth behavioral health system

#### REACH Engagement Content

- At these meetings, we plan to:
  - Share a PowerPoint about REACH

  - Provide a one-pager with takeaways and our contact information for follow-up discussions

Our goal is to invite people to **actively participate in the changes**, rather than simply gathering information from them.

## User-Friendly Terms for Services



#### Terms for Services

- Currently, we are referring to services as In-Home and Community-based Supportive and Therapeutic Services (IHCSTS)
- While we understand that this term is dense, we want to convey the types of services families can access through REACH

## In-Home and Community-based Supportive and Therapeutic and Services (IHCSTS)

- ► Individualized, strength-based interventions to correct or ameliorate behavioral health conditions that interfere with a child's functioning
- Supportive and therapeutic interventions
  - ► Help the child to build skills necessary for successful functioning in the home and community and
  - Improve the family's or caregiver's ability to help the child successfully function in the home and community
- Interventions delivered according to a care plan developed by the care planning team

#### Terms for Services from Other States

- Other states use terms such as:
  - Intensive Home-Based Services (IHB) Illinois
  - Intensive mental health services Washington
  - Covered services Ohio
- ► All states have handouts which describe the specific services available through their programs
- Iowa will also create these materials as services are defined over the next year

#### Other Potential Terms for Services

- Other terms we thought about include:
  - Whole person supports in the home and community
  - Community-connected therapeutic services
  - Personalized in-home behavioral supports
- We hope for these terms to convey
  - Where services can be accessed (home and community)
  - Services are tailored to the family's needs, and can be both supportive and therapeutic
    - Services are meaningfully different from what is currently available
