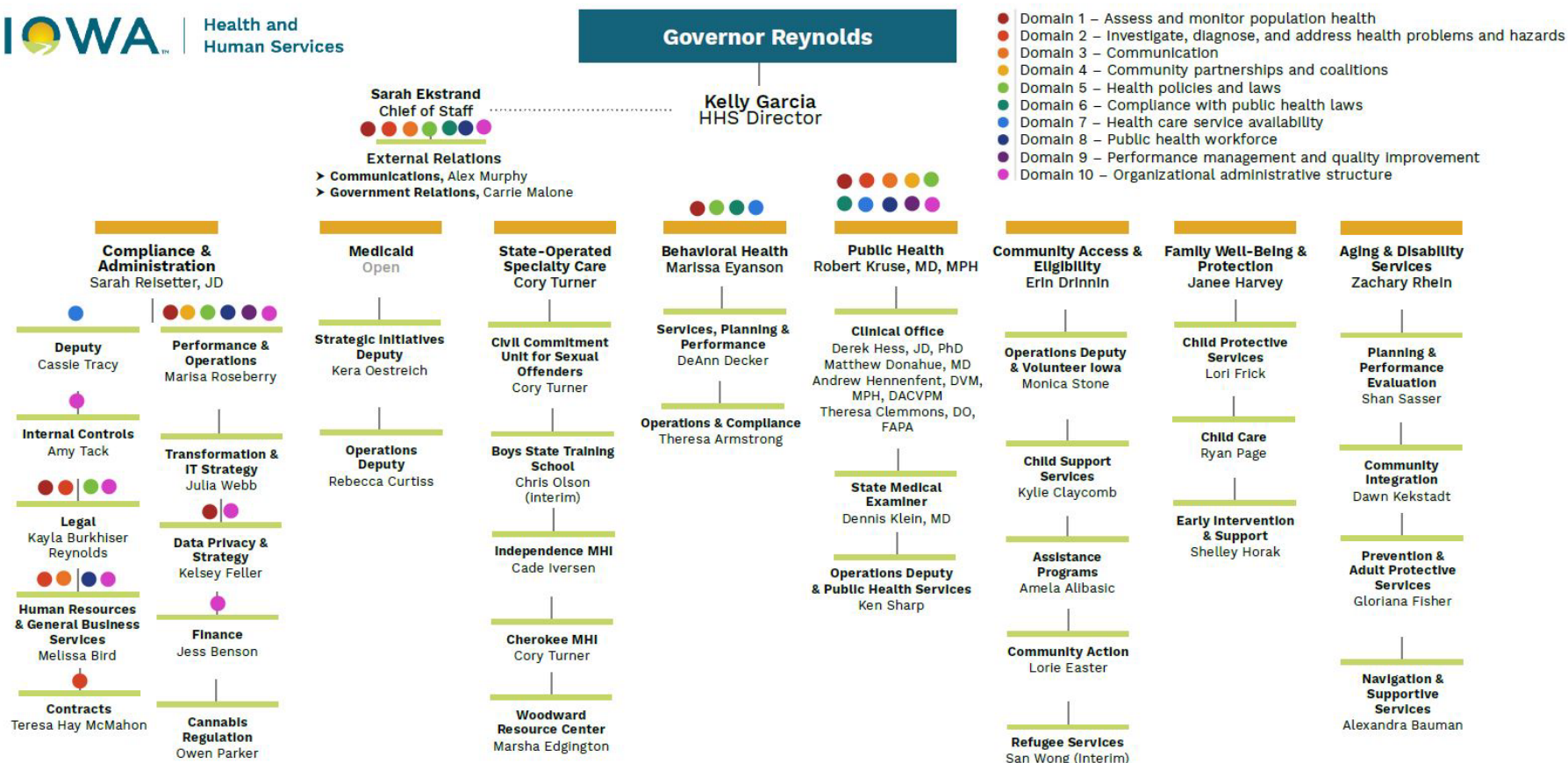


What is Public Health Accreditation?

- The accrediting entity for state, local and Tribal public health departments in the Public Health Accreditation Board (PHAB)
- Accreditation outlines the best practices that high performing public health agencies should be able to demonstrate
- The accreditation framework is built off the 10 Essential Public Health Services and the Foundational Capabilities

Submitted 104 pieces of required documentation

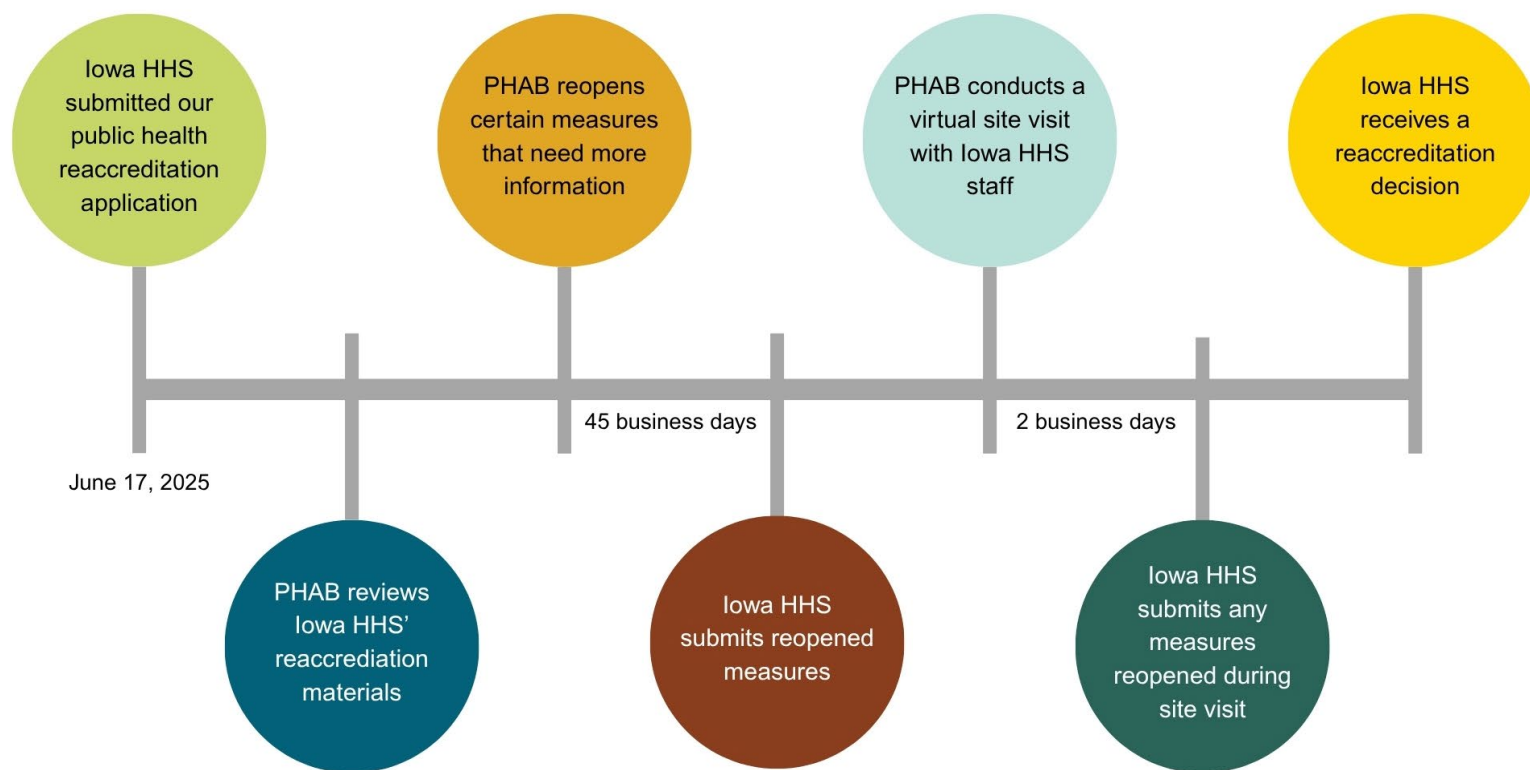


Completed site-visitor training
