#### What is the intended benefit of the rule?

641—Chapter 3 implements Iowa's Early Hearing Detection and Intervention program (EHDI), which provides for universal hearing screening for all newborns and infants in Iowa. The goal of the program is early detection of hearing loss to allow children and their families the earliest possible opportunity to obtain appropriate early intervention services.

Is the benefit being achieved? Please provide evidence.

Yes. Hearing loss is the most frequently occurring birth defect. Approximately 2-3 per 1,000 babies born in US have some level of hearing difference. Another 3 per 1,000 will develop hearing differences in early childhood (late onset). Without early intervention, children with hearing differences are at risk of falling behind typically-hearing peers in language, social-emotional, and academic skills.
