HCBS Waiver and Habilitation updates-January 1, 2026 changes



Proposed Waiver Amendments



HHS released proposed waiver amendments to the current HCBS waivers for public comment on Aug. 20, 2025



HHS intends to request CMS approval for proposed waiver amendments to go-live on January 1, 2026



The goal of making these changes now rather than waiting for the new HOME waiver go-live is to set up structures to ease the transition from the current to new waivers in the future

Summary of Proposed Waiver Changes

- ► Transition Individual Consumer Directed Attendant Care (I-CDAC)
- ▶ Implement and collect data on core set of interRAI items
- ► Use of InterRAI-Early Years for 0-3
- ► Implement amended Waiver Prioritization Needs Assessment (WPNA)
- ► Align service definitions (see slide 8)
- ► Make technical changes, such as:
 - Move to a single assessment entity
 - Update Independent Support Broker (ISB) to optional
 - Minor language updates (e.g., "exception to policy" verbiage)

Service Alignment

- •Two components of service alignment:
 - •Aligning definitions across the current HCBS waivers
 - Updating service definitions to reflect merged services under the proposed HOME waivers
- Intended to simplify and smooth the transition from the current waivers to new HOME waivers in the future
- •Merging services is intended to help connect members to the right services to best match their needs

For instance,

some waiver services have different names but similar or overlapping service definitions

Hope and Opportunity in Many Environments (**HOME**) Overview

Hope and Opportunity in Many Environments (HOME) is a project in Iowa that is working to improve and ensure that everyone has access to high-quality behavioral health, disability and aging services in their communities.



Hope and Opportunity in Many Environments (**HOME**) Overview



ALIGN PROGRAM DESIGN TO MEET IOWANS' NEEDS

- Restructure waivers to simplify options, provide a broader service array, and better address the needs of all age groups and disability types including children, older adults, and lowans with autism
- Support for transitioning from diagnosis-based to needs-based waiver structure
- Address provider capacity issues alongside waiver changes to ensure lowans can access needed waiver services

Proposed Waiver Structure Update

Change waiver structure

- Remove six diagnosis-based waivers
- Add two age-based waivers

Keep the current Elderly Waiver for members age 65+ who are not otherwise disabled

- Members on the Adult with Disabilities Waiver who have a disability will stay on that waiver after age 65
- Services in the Elderly Waiver will not change at this time
 - May change over time to include services that delay or divert institutional care



Proposed New Waiver Structure



ELIGIBILITY & ENROLLMENT | To be eligible, individuals must meet two criteria: (1) they need the level of care that would be provided in an institution, and (2) their disability fits into one of the categories below.



HOME Waiver Implementation Phasing


The implementation of HOME waivers will be phased; not all services will be transitioned in initially.

Intensive Residential Services (IRS) Certification and Recertification



IRS

- ► Intensive Residential Services (IRS) are intended to serve adults with the most severe and persistent mental health conditions who have functional impairments and may also have multi-occurring conditions.
- ► This service provides intensive **24-hour** supervision, behavioral health services, and other supportive services in a community-based residential setting.
- ▶ Providers of intensive residential service homes (IRSH) are enrolled with Medicaid as providers of home and community-based services (HCBS) habilitation home-based habilitation (HBH) or HCBS intellectual disability (ID) waiver supported community living (SCL), & meet additional criteria specified in rule, manual, the waiver application and State Plan Amendment (SPA)



Certification for IRS

- ► The Mental Health Disability Services Regions were transitioned to Behavioral Health Districts July 1, 2025.
- ► lowa Medicaid is assuming responsibility for certification and recertification of IRS providers and IRSH locations.
- ► To be eligible for IRS certification, a provider must delivered Supported Community Living (SCL) or a Home-Based Habilitation (HBH) service for a minimum of one year or more and be a provider in good standing with Iowa Medicaid.
- ►IRS certification is granted for a maximum of one (1) year, and annual recertification is required to maintain eligibility.



Certification for IRS

- ► lowa Medicaid's HCBS Quality Improvement Organization (QIO) will begin certifying new IRS applicants and recertifying current IRS providers and the approval of IRS settings during Fall/Winter 2025.
- ► Current IRS providers whose MHDS regional designation has or will soon expire will be prioritized for certification.
- ► Certification and recertification process will be similar to the current process for certification of Residential-based Supported Community Living (RBSCL) providers and approval of RBSCL settings.
- ► Initial certification and annual recertification will include onsite visits and record reviews.



Certification for IRS

QIO HCBS Provider Quality Oversight consists of 6 regional provider quality specialists and 1 application specialist.




QIO HCBS is responsible for quality oversight of **over 440 Medicaid-enrolled providers of HCBS services**.

Provider-Self Assessment (PSA) Application Launch

- ► Web-based application was developed within IMPA that allows providers direct, real-time submission of updates to their organization information and report HCBS settings in a centralized location for review and approval by HCBS Provider Quality Specialists.
- ▶ Application usage is required for HCBS providers who are enrolled for services requiring participation in HCBS quality oversight processes, including the self-assessment.

PSA Application Use

- ► Review Informational Letter #2698 for registration instructions
- ► View PSA Application Training, user guide, and other resources
- ► Access the PSA application and review existing information.
- ▶ Any updates or changes made by your organization will be reviewed by your HCBS specialist and either be accepted, or rejected with a reason provided.
- ► Access the application regularly to keep information current, including reporting new or closed HCBS settings prior to service delivery or within 30 days of the change.
- ► Complete annual self-assessment questionnaire when released each fall.
- ► Complete "change" self-assessment questionnaire as directed when enrolling additional HCBS services.



PSA Application Features

- ▶ The application includes four main components:
 - Organization details,
 - Enrollments and qualifications,
 - HCBS settings,
 - Self-assessment questionnaire.




Setting Detail

Tips and Troubleshooting

PSA Application IS:

- Mandatory for routine provider use.
- For communication and maintenance of records with QIO HCBS only.
- Designed to time out after 10 minutes for security reasons. A 2-minute warning will pop up after 8 minutes of inactivity.

PSA Application IS NOT:

- Used for documents related to quality oversight review activities.
- A substitute for processes with Iowa Medicaid Provider Enrollment or Provider Services or MCOs.
 - All enrollment, service application, and address change forms still apply.
 - Updates in the PSA Application do not currently transfer to IoWANs, MMIS, managed care entities (MCOs), or any other provider system outside of QIO HCBS.
