


What is Early ACCESS?

- Early ACCESS is Iowa's early intervention system (IDEA Part C)
- For eligible infants and toddlers under three years old
- IA- 25% delay in at least one area or have a diagnosed condition that can delay typical development
- Anyone can refer
- Voluntary participation
- IA-Birth Mandate, no wait lists
- IA- No cost to families

- Focus on helping parents and other caregivers so that they can support their child's growth and development during everyday routines and activities
- Variety of services (e.g., developmental services, instruction, physical therapy, speech, occupational therapy)

Early ACCESS Interagency System & Grantees



Child Find

- All agencies play a role in finding children
 - AEAs screenings & evaluations, NICU liaison
 - Dept of Education- inform public- IFSN
 - Dept of Health & Human Servicesscreening, refer all children with founded abuse
 - U of I screening, family navigators,
 NICU family support specialist



Early ACCESS NICU Presence

Des Moines Metro - Blank & Mercy NICU

- In person at NICU 1 x week
- Collaborate with medical staff
- Meeting families: building rapport, helping with smooth transition, accessing services

UIHC NICU Family Support Specialist

- Former NICU and Early ACCESS parent
- Listen, Support, Connect, and Information

Early ACCESS Eligibility

- A child is eligible based on diagnosed condition
- A child is eligible based on a 25% delay in at least one developmental area
- A child is eligible based on the team's informed clinical opinion



Diagnosed Condition

A child who has a diagnosed and documented physical or mental condition which has a high probability of resulting in developmental delays is automatically eligible for Early ACCESS.

A child with diagnosed hearing loss is eligible for Early ACCESS.

• If child doesn't have a diagnosis or obvious delay, refer and let Early ACCESS evaluate to determine if qualify.

Early Intervention Services

Services are designed to meet the developmental needs of an infant of toddler with a disability and the needs of the family as identified by the team. Potential services that can be provided:

Assistive technology device	Psychological services
Audiology services	Service coordination
Family training, counseling, and home visits	Sign language and cued language services
Nutrition services	Social work services
Occupational therapy	Special instruction
Physical therapy	Speech-language pathology services
Psychological services	Vision services

Early Intervention (EI) Model



Child-centered services	Child-centered services	Family-centered services	
Therapy focuses on alleviating or "fixing" deficits identified on standardized testing	Therapy focuses on improving the student's ability to succeed in the school environment	Services focus on improving the child's learning and development during naturally occurring routines and activities	
Therapy sessions are provided one-on-one (therapist and child)	Therapy sessions are provided one-on-one (therapist and child) or in a small group setting with other students	Services are provided to the caregiver in the presence of the child, siblings, and other family members; these regularly scheduled sessions are referred to as "home visits" or "EI sessions" instead of "therapy sessions"	
Therapy toys and materials are provided by the therapist	Therapy toys and materials are provided by the therapist	Any toys and materials used should be part of the child's natural environment	
Therapy is provided in an outpatient clinic or hospital setting	Therapy is provided in the school setting	Services are provided in the child's natural environment (home or community setting)



- AEA's receive referral verify child is not already served
- Child is assigned a service coordinator (SC)
- SC attempts to contact family within 2 working days of being assigned the referral
- If contact made, and family interested, move ahead with scheduling intake and evaluation/assessment visits

Early ACCESS Process: Eligibility and Assessment





- Service coordinator assembles team to evaluate/assess based on family concerns
- Review records, if eligible based on a diagnosed condition move to assessment
- If no diagnosed condition, provide comprehensive evaluation to determine delay
- If eligible, develop IFSP

All this accomplished within 45 days from referral

Individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP)

Written documentation of who will do what, when and where for a 6 months period of timean change as needs of the child/family change.

Includes:

- specific information about the child and family, for example, the child's current developmental status
- Sets reasonable developmental goals for the infant or toddler
- States the services that Early ACCESS will provide- providing services in the child's natural environment
- As child approaches three years old a Transition plan out of Early ACCESS

The Individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP) is a plan written specifically for Spencer and your family by you and the Early ACCESS providers. The IFSP can change over time as your child and family's priorities and needs change. The IFSP includes a summary of information about Spencer and your family, outcome(s) you want to see for Spencer and your family, and Early ACCESS services.

Early ACCESS Service Coordinator

Every family who participates in Early ACCESS is assigned a service coordinator. The Early ACCESS service coordinator will communicate with the team to coordinate meetings, assessments, and assist in developing IFSPs. The service coordinator will also partner with you to identify the appropriate services, resources, and support necessary to benefit your family and Spencer's growth and development.

- I do not give consent and am declining all Early ACCESS services. I understand I may contact Early ACCESS at any time before my child turns three to reinitiate the evaluation process.

In accepting Early ACCESS services:

I understand that my consent:

- May be withdrawn at any time and does not affect actions that occurred between when consent was given and revoked; and,
- May exclude or withdraw from a particular Early ACCESS service(s) without affecting other services provided in the IFSP.
