What is Iowa REACH?

lowa REACH is a new Medicaid program that helps kids and teens with mental health challenges. The initiative provides improved services at home and in the community to give kids the support they need to grow.

Mobile Crisis Services

The REACH Initiative may help children and youth with different needs like:

- Children with multiple needs that result from behavioral health challenges
- Have multisystem needs or are at risk for deeper system involvement
- Are at risk of out-of-home placement or are returning to their families from out-of-home placement



What special services does lowa REACH provide to members?

A Care Coordinator who helps with planning and connecting to services, including:

- Intensive Home-Based Treatment (IHBT)
- Behavioral Health Respite
- Primary Flex Funds
- Mobile Response and Stabilization
 Services (MRSS) Available to all youth
- In-state Psychiatric Residential Treatment Facilities (PRTFs)

- Eligible for Iowa Medicaid (either managed care or fee-for-service)
- Between the ages 0-21 at the time of enrollment
