

What is Iowa REACH?

Iowa REACH is a new Medicaid program that supports behavioral health services for youth across the state. It offers supportive resources to help them stay in their homes and be part of their communities.

REACH stands for Responsive and Excellent Care for Healthy Youth.

The REACH Initiative may help children and youth with different needs like:

- Children with multiple needs that result from behavioral health challenges.
- Have complex needs or are at risk for deeper system involvement.
- Are at risk of out-of-home placement or are returning to their families from out-of-home placement.

The **REACH initiative** was created to address the challenges many young Iowans and their families experience, like gaps in support, delays in getting care, and uncertainty about where to turn for help.

REACH is designed to connect services, simplify the system, and make it easier for families to find the support they need, when they need it.



What supportive services could Iowa REACH provide to members?

A Care Coordinator who helps with planning and connecting to services, including:

- Intensive Home-Based Treatment (IHBT)
- Behavioral Health Respite
- Primary Flex Funds
- Mobile Response and Stabilization Services (MRSS)
- In-state Psychiatric
- Residential Treatment Facilities (PRTFs)

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
