Molina High School Scholarship

\$90,000

In partnership with the Iowa Health Care Association Foundation, the MolinaCares High School Scholarship program awards scholarships to students pursuing healthcare careers, including certified nursing assistant, licensed practical nurse, registered nurse, and Bachelor of Science in nursing. In 4 years, **41 high school seniors** from across Iowa received **\$2,000 scholarships**, helping fulfill the grant partnership's goal to build a crucial pipeline of highly skilled healthcare workers to meet current and future long-term needs in Iowa, especially in rural communities.

Project ECHO-

The overarching goal is to increase Iowa's capacity to care for adults with IDD and complex care needs in the community through education, training, and collaboration by increasing training and education to direct support professionals/community care providers on adults with IDD and complex care needs.



Direct Support Professionals

Intellectual/Developmental Disability and Complex Care Needs

Individuals with IDD and co-occurring mental illness, medical illness and/or challenging behavior

ECHO uses videoconferencing to connect interdisciplinary teams of specialists and subject matter experts. Together, the hub team and participants develop advanced skills and best practices through collaboration and case-based learning in an "all teach, all learn" environment.



Iowa's IDD Complex Care Needs ECHO is a partnership between:



HealthTeamWorks Rural Community Health Worker Learning and Network Collaborative

- HealthTeamWorks to establish and facilitate a **learning community for rural CHWs and supervisors** to strengthen peer connections, problem-solve implementation barriers, and inform statewide CHW sustainability planning. The collaborative would include four virtual learning sessions (with guest speakers) and four facilitated peer discussions, supporting knowledge exchange on data collection, reimbursement, and documenting CHW impact.
- This concept complements the Healthy Hometowns Rural Transformation initiative announced by Governor Reynolds (Nov. 2025) by building CHW readiness to support rural innovation in community-based health systems.
- **Deliverables:**
 - 4 webinar sessions featuring subject matter experts on topics such as data tracking, billing, and rural health partnerships
 - 4 facilitated peer discussions for CHWs to share best practices and challenges
 - Brief learning summary after each session for participants and Molina
 - Final summary report to Molina including lessons learned, barriers identified, and opportunities for scaling
 - Integration summary connecting outcomes to Iowa CHW Alliance goals, including sustainable funding and cross-sector partnerships
- Launch December 2025
