Reporting

Iowa Administrative Code 641-1.3(139) stipulates that the laboratory and the healthcare provider immediately report any suspected or confirmed case. The reporting number for Iowa HHS Center for Acute Disease Epidemiology (CADE) is **(800) 362-2736**. After business hours, call the Iowa State Patrol Office at **(515) 323-4360** to page the on-call CADE staff.

Before a Case Occurs

- ▶ Know measles signs and symptoms.
- ▶ Make sure individuals have record of MMR vaccine or are considered immune to measles.
- ▶ Recommend staff ensure they have received MMR vaccine or are considered immune to measles.
- ▶ Let families and staff know if they have not received MMR vaccine, they may need to quarantine at home for 21 days each time exposure to measles occurs.
