- b. Introductions Were made by the Board members and staff in attendance.
- c. **Announcements –** Ramsey and VanRoekel reappointed to new terms to begin May 1, 2021. No board vacancies.
- 2. Approval of Open Session Minutes

a. December 8, 2020

Peterson moved the approval of the December 8, 2020 meeting minutes as presented. A second was received by Ramsey. All ayes, nays none, motion carried.

3. Reports

a. Board Executive Report - Board Executive Vendoures Walsh reported there are currently 1,033 active licensed athletic trainers and 976 inactive licensees. Individuals with an inactive license may apply to reactivate the license online, pay the fee and provide evidence of continuing education.

Vendoures Walsh said staff continue to rotate into the office and process applications.

The Board of Certification has a Compliance and Regulatory Education (CARE) conference that was scheduled for July 2021 but it has been postponed until July 2022. In place of the conference this year there will be a series of webinars.

b. Board Chair Report - Audra Ramsey stated she had nothing to report.

c. AAG Report – Proclamations and license renewal. AT license expired February 28th. Licensees can renew on time and attest to continuing education completion but are not required to renew or complete the continuing education until 60 days after the proclamation expires which currently is set for April 4th. Licensees have until the end of that 60 day period to complete continuing education. Nothing in the rules prohibits or limits online continuing education for Athletic Trainers.

4. Administrative Rules

a. ARC 5367C Notice of Intended Action to adopt new Chapter 14 "Use of Criminal Convictions in Eligibility Determinations and Initial Licensing Decisions," new Chapter 19 "License by Verification and Applicants with Work Experience," and to amend Chapter 4, "Board Administrative Processes," Chapter 5, "Fees," and Chapter 20 "Military Service, Veteran Reciprocity, and Spouses of Active Duty Service Members," Iowa Administrative Code.

Ramsey moved the Board adopt ARC 5367C new Chapter 14 "Use of Criminal Convictions in Eligibility Determinations and Initial Licensing Decisions," new Chapter 19 "License by Verification and Applicants with Work Experience," and to amend Chapter

4, "Board Administrative Processes," Chapter 5, "Fees," and Chapter 20 "Military Service, Veteran Reciprocity, and Spouses of Active Duty Service Members," Iowa Administrative Code. A second was received by Peterrson. All ayes, nays none, motion carried.

5. Public Comment – Board Member Ramsey shared a question from the public regarding the continuing education rules. Mike Haden questions why the state of Iowa won't allow published research articles to count as continuing education when the BOC does allow this.

The Board discussed that some journals will provide continuing education hours when you write for them. The Board reviewed the continuing education chapter and consensus is to review a draft amendment to the chapter at the next meeting to provide credit to licensees for their academic work.
