

Monitor temperatures closely!

- 1. Write staff initials in "Staff Initials," and note the time in "Exact Time."
- 2. Record temperatures twice each workday.
- 3. Record the min/max temperatures once each workday preferably in the morning.
- 4. Write the temperature in the row that corresponds to the refrigerator's temperature.
- 5. For out-of-range temperatures, see instructions to the right.
- 6. Bimonthly, download and print data logger data.
- 7. Maintain printed data logger data and temperature logs together for a minimum of three years.

Take action if temperatures are out of range – too warm (above 46°F) or too cold (below 36°F).

- 1. Label exposed vaccine "do not use," and store it under proper conditions as quickly as possible.
- Do not discard vaccines unless directed to by the Iowa Immunization Program and/or the manufacturer(s).
- 2. Record the out-of-range temperatures and the room temperature in the "Action" area on the bottom of the log.
- 3. Notify the clinic vaccine coordinator and call the Iowa Immunization Program at 1-800-831-6293.
- 4. Document the action taken on the Emergency Response Worksheet and Troubleshooting Record.
