Unwind: End of the Continuous Coverage Requirement



Continuous Coverage Requirement is Ending

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The continuous coverage requirement is ending April 1st, 2023



This does not mean that members will automatically lose their coverage April 1st



Most members must have a full eligibility renewal completed before their coverage can be discontinued



PHE End Date

- May 11, 2023 final expiration date
- Additional information about timing of PHE specific unwinding will be released in mid-March
- Flexibilities that are tied to the PHE include telehealth, expanded service options for LTSS members, and COVID-19 vaccine coverage

Resetting Renewal Dates for Most Members





- Redistributed caseload and renewal dates per CMS guidance and to help future year workload equalization.
- Case specific information and member contact information cannot be shared with stakeholders.
- Those with access to IMPA can identify member renewal dates on the Case Information screen.



Mitigation Strategies

Eligibility Workforce

- Leveraging OT hours
- Identifying workers from specialized units to aid processing any backlogs as needed
- Statewide equalization/distribution of workloads
- Refresher trainings for all eligibility workers

Member Contact and Outreach

- MCO texting campaign
- NCOA database comparison
- SNAP/TANF address clean-up
- Target email notifications
- Social media messaging and reminders
- Renewal outreach from MCOs

Discontinuances

After their renewal is completed, a Notice of Action/Notice of Decision will be mailed to all households letting them know if they were renewed for a new certification period or if their Medicaid is ending.

Discontinuances for the first set of renewals will be effective May Ist.
