Important Information About Your FIP

Under federal law, families can only get Family Investment Program (FIP) for 60 months.

Your FIP benefits will stop after 60 months. Our records show that you have received FIP for ____ months and have ____ months left.

It's important that you plan how to become self-supporting by the time your FIP benefits end. Your PROMISE JOBS worker can help you with that.

If you get FIP for your children, FIP will stop for the whole family.

If you get FIP for a child that's not yours (like a grandchild, niece or nephew) and for yourself, only you will be taken off of FIP at the end of 60 months. You can still get FIP for the child.
