## A New Law Satisfies Support Payments

What support is satisfied? Unpaid support older than October 1, 1997 owed to the State is satisfied under this law.

**Is support due my family being satisfied?** No, support due the family is not being satisfied. We will continue to enforce this balance for you.

Why is the law satisfying this old support? Satisfying older support owed to the State allows more of the support that is collected to be paid to the family.
